RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. Dogs entered at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows must be registered at the Kennel Club in accordance with Kennel Club Regulations for Classification and Registration B. The registration number/Authority to Compete number will be required for each entry.
2. Entry fees: £2.95 per dog per class, £6.00 per pair. Camping fees: £25.00 per space for 3 nights (Thurs, Fri, Sat)
3. No Prize Money is on offer.
4. Entries must be made on the official form or a photocopy thereof. Internet entries will be accepted via www.simplycanine.co.uk.
5. The Committee reserves the right to refuse entries.
6. Only dogs of 18 calendar months of age and over on the day of competition are eligible for competition at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows and Flyball Competitions.
7. Not for competition, entries will be accepted for dogs aged four months and over. Dogs must be Kennel Club registered with their details recorded on the entry form.
8. No bitch in season is allowed to compete.
9. No person shall carry out punitive correction or harsh handling of a dog at any time within the boundaries of the Show.
10. Dogs must not wear any type of slip, half slip collar or lead when under test. A flat, close fitting leather or webbing collar is permitted providing the only attachment is a plain identification panel as an integral part of the collar i.e. not attached by a ring.
11. Should a judge be unable to fulfil the appointment to judge the Committee reserves the right to appoint another judge.
12. No competitor shall impugn the decision of the judge or judges.
13. Thank you to our sponsors – Brillo Bounce, Jewlnick, Pawstrading, Dog Vegas
14. Kennel Club Standard marking Regulations apply.
15. The height of hurdles for Veteran classes will be 450mm for large dogs, 350mm for medium dogs and 228mm for small dogs. The height of hurdles for Any Size classes will be 350mm for large dogs and 228mm for medium and small dogs.
16. The Height limit for dogs:
 - a. Large Dogs – For dogs measuring over 430mm (1ft 5ins) at the withers.
 - b. Medium Dogs - For dogs measuring over 350mm (1ft 1.75ins) and measuring 430mm (1ft 5ins) or under at the withers.
 - c. Small Dogs – For dogs measuring 350mm (1ft 1.75ins) or under at the withers.
17. Judges at an Agility Show may not enter for competition a dog, which is recorded in their ownership or part ownership; or handle a dog at the Show at which they are judging. Dogs will be disqualified if proved to have been handled by the scheduled judge's spouse or immediate family, or resident at the same address as the scheduled judge.
18. Withdrawal of dogs from Competition - A dog shall be withdrawn from competition and removed from an Agility Show if it is:
 - d. A bitch, which is in season.
 - e. Suffering from any infectious diseases or contagious disease.
 - f. Interfering with the safety or chance of winning of an opponent.
 - g. Of such temperament or is so much out of hand as to be a danger to the safety of any person or other animal.
 - h. Likely to cause suffering to the dog if it continues competing.
19. In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including 25 days before the start of the competition, i.e. 07/07/2013, shall be counted when entering any class. For these purposes a competition shall be defined as all classes covered within the same schedule. In the event that a dog becomes eligible for the next grade at a particular show, after the entry for that show has been sent, it is the competitor's responsibility to notify the show secretary at least 14 days before the date of the show (19/07/2013) The dog will then be moved into the appropriate class(es) for the next grade. The dog must be moved into the Corresponding number of classes as were entered at the lower grade. If there are fewer or no classes available for the next grade the competitor will be offered a refund of the relevant entry fees.
20. Should circumstances so dictate the Society, in consultation with the Judges may alter arrangements as necessary. Such changes and the circumstances surrounding them must be reported to the Kennel Club.
21. In the event that the show is cancelled due to unforeseen circumstances, the club/society will refund fees less reasonably incurred expenses, on receipt of a stamped addressed envelope submitted within 1 month of the show date.
22. Food shall not be carried in the hand or given to the dog in the ring.
23. Should the judge deem a re-run is required, any result and/or faults gained in the previous run must be discounted.
24. Separate entry forms must be completed by each competitor and must be signed by the competitor or his authorised agent in accordance with provisions specified thereon. Entry forms must be accompanied with the appropriate fees.
25. Passes are not required to gain entry to the show/showground.
26. Competition of Dogs Suffering from Contagious or Infectious Disease - No dogs suffering from infectious or contagious disease or having been exposed to such disease during 21 days prior to the competition may compete. Competitors infringing the Regulation will be liable to be fined and /or dealt with under the Kennel Club Rule A42.
27. It is the competitor's responsibility to be available for their class and running order. Competitors must run as close to their running order as possible. Failure to do so may be reported to the Kennel Club. In Championship classes competitors must run in exact running order specified in the Regulations.
28. Animals in Event
No other animal other than one officially entered shall be brought into the precincts of the event during it's continuance, except any dogs registered o assist the disabled, or dogs required for educational or instructional purposes or by permission of the General Committee. However, at the discretion of the show society, a dog brought to the show by a spectator may be admitted into the precincts of the dog show with the proviso that those in charge of the dog sign a declaration confirming that the dog is free from disease and that the dog will be kept under control at all times.
29. All dogs registered and resident outside the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete number before entry the show/event can be made. All overseas entries without a Kennel Club Registration number or an Authority to compete number will be returned to the exhibitor/competitor.
30. A pay on the day class will be held if time and weather permits.
31. A practice ring may be available to dogs entered for competition at the show if time and space allows. This ring to be supervised by a responsible adult with agility knowledge.
32. Welfare of Dogs
An exhibitor/competitor whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog[s] are met, and should knowingly put their dogs health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. A breach of this regulation may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rules and Regulations.
33. All dogs entered at this show are at the owner's risk. Whilst every care will be taken, the Committee and Organisers will not accept responsibility for loss, damage or injury, however caused to persons, dogs or property at the show.
34. Overpaid entries will NOT be refunded.
35. Strictly NO refunds after the closing date.
36. Camping: Spaces will be allocated and each pitch will me a minimum of 9m x 10m. Units must be placed as per the map that will be provided.
37. Maximum of 2 dogs off-lead per adult in the exercise area.
38. Anyone found not picking up after their dogs will be asked to leave the venue immediately.
39. No selling of goods on the show venue without prior permission.
40. A charge of £10.00 will be made for any returned / unpaid cheques.

ELIGIBILITY OF CLASSES

In the following definitions of classes First Prizes or other prize wins are those gained in standard classes at any Kennel Club licensed Open Agility Shows (i.e. Limited Agility Shows, special classes and invitation events excepted). Only a first place with a clear round within course time will count towards grade progression.

Agility classes to include contact points and Jumping classes where there are no contact obstacles. With this proviso classes are defined as follows:-

Class Structure. A Class may either be held as a Graded Class or a Combined Class. A Graded Class may be scheduled for one or more consecutive Grades with separate results and awards issued for each grade. A Combined Class may be scheduled for more than one consecutive grade with one overall set of results.

Progression. Progression from each Grade will require one Agility win or three Jumping wins at that grade, except that progression from Grade 5 will require 3 wins at Grade 5, one of which must be agility classes. Progression from grade 6 will require 4 wins at grade 6 two of which must be agility. Results from Combined Classes will only count towards progression from the dog's current grade.

Points Progression. At the handler's discretion a dog may progress up to Grade 4 by winning 100 points at each grade, using the Agility Warrant points scheme (Regulation K3.c refers), except that there is no requirement for a minimum number of agility points. If this method of progression is selected, the handler must ensure the Show Secretary signs the dog's Agility Record Book at the first show entered at the higher grade. There is no time limit on this progression, however once a dog has progressed, it cannot return to a previous grade.

STANDARD CLASSES

Only first prizes and points gained in standard classes at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows may be used for progression through the classes. (A dog is only eligible for one grade). In defining the eligibility of the owner or handler for Grade 1, three jumping wins and points progression referred to in the definition apply only to one dog and not to an accumulation of dogs.

Grade 1 (Elementary)

For owners, handlers or dogs which have not gained a 1st place in an Agility Class or three 1st places in Jumping Classes at K.C licensed Agility Shows. Owners handlers or dogs previously qualified out of grade 1 [Elementary] are not eligible for this class.

Grade 2 (Starters)

Open to dogs which are not eligible for grades 1,3,4,5,6,7, and have not gained a first place in an agility class or three first places in jumping classes at Grade 2 at kennel Club licensed Agility shows, or elected to progress on points from grade 1. *N>B Owners handlers or dogs previously qualified out of Grade 2 [Starters] are not eligible for this class.*

Grade 3 (Graduate)

Open to dogs which are not eligible for Grade 1 or 2 or have elected to progress on points from Grade 2 at K.C licensed Agility Shows and dogs which are not eligible for Grade 4,5,6,or 7.

Grade 4 (Novice)

Open to dogs which have gained a 1st place in an Agility Class or three 1st places in Jumping Classes at Grade 3 or elected to progress on points from Grade 3 at K.C licensed Agility Shows and are not eligible for Grade 3,5,6,7.

Grade 5 (Intermediate)

Open to dogs which have gained a 1st place in an Agility class or three 1st places in Jumping Classes at Grade 4 at K.C licensed Agility Shows and are not eligible for Grade 3,4,6,7.

Grade 6 (Senior)

Open to dogs which have gained 3 first places at grade 5 at kennel club licensed shows, one of which must have been gained in an agility (not jumping) class, and are not eligible for Grade 3,4,5or 7.

Grade 7 (Advanced)

Open to all dogs which have gained a minimum of four 1st places at Grade 6 at K.C licensed Agility Shows Two 1st places must be gained in Agility not Jumping classes.

SPECIAL CLASSES

Please note that in all special classes, standard Kennel Club marking will apply.

For sponsored classes or qualifiers, please read the relevant rules as they may differ from those below.

Veterans: Open to all dogs 7 years or over on the day of the show and not entered in any other classes over the week (other Veteran and Any Size classes excepted). These classes will not include weaves or a tyre and the course time will be 60 seconds. Jump heights for Large dogs will be 450mm and for the Small and Medium dogs will be 228mm. All dogs will compete against each other over the same course at the dog's applicable jump height with one set of awards.

Any Size: Open to all dogs not entered in any other classes over the weekend (other Any Size and Veteran classes excepted). Jumps will be set at 350mm for Large dogs and 228mm for Small and Medium dogs. These classes will not include weaves or a tyre. The course time will be 60 seconds. All heights of dogs will compete against each other over the same course at the dog's applicable jump height with one set of awards.

Dog Vegas/Jewlnick Diamond pairs see separate rules.

Jayne Bray Memorial Steeple Chase this class is for all heights combined large dogs will run over large height, small and medium dogs over small height. All profits from this class will go to the willen hospice in the Jayne Bray memorial fund.

Dog Vegas / Jewlnick Diamond Pairs Combined 1-7 agility. Open to All Heights (Class 69)

1. Each Pair to consist of 2 dogs of the same height, either 2 Small, 2 Medium or 2 Large. No other combination.
2. The course should include all 3 contacts (weather permitting) & 6 weave. With a minimum of 14 obstacles.
3. This is a relay with a baton.
4. Any dog that results in elimination would incur 100 faults.
5. The top 3 pairs from each heat would be invited to the Dog Vegas / Jewlnick Diamond Pairs Final that would be held at the 12th-14th October Dog Vegas Show in 2013.

Sponsor trophies to 1st place, sponsor rosettes 1st to 5th place.

Large Dogs Combined Agility Grades 3, 4 & 5 (Class 22)

Competition Rules

The "Dog Vegas Qualifier" is a competition for Large dogs eligible for Grades 3, 4 & 5. There are **12 qualifying heats**. The top 5 dogs from each heat (top 3 if the heat is split into 2 parts), will qualify for the **Kronch Final** comprising of approx 60 at the Dog Vegas show at the end of July.

1. This class must be judged under the appropriate Kennel Club Rules in force at the time of the competition.
2. If the entry for a heat exceeds the KC limit for a judge in a day then the class will be equally and randomly split and another judge appointed for the second part.
3. All competitors entering the class will be deemed to have agreed to abide by the rules of the Kennel Club and the specific regulations governing this class.
4. The competition is open to Kennel Club registered dogs eligible to compete at Large Height Grade 3, 4 & 5.
5. Handlers may enter more than one dog in the competition and may qualify more than one dog for the final event.
6. Once a dog has qualified for the final it may enter further heats, as long as it is still eligible for Grade 3, 4 or 5. Handlers who have already qualified their dog for the final must report this fact to the appropriate Show Secretary before running in the class. If the already qualified dog then qualifies again, the place will be awarded to the highest placed unqualified dog.
7. The first five dogs from the heat will be invited to compete in the final. The next five dogs will be held as reserves. If the class is split the top three dogs from each part will be invited to compete in the final. The next top three in each part will be held as reserves.
8. In the event of a dog being unable to compete in the final due to unavailability, illness or injury the reserves from that heat will be called up in numerical order.
9. In the event of a handler being unable to compete in the final due to illness or injury a substitute handler for the qualifying dog will be allowed to run the dog.

Two Dog Agility competitions; one for Small Dogs Grades 1 –7 and one for Medium Dogs Grades 1 –7. There will be at least 10 heats for each size of dog (20 qualifiers) held at shows around the country with the top 3 of each size qualifier being invited to the final.

The qualifiers must be held either with classic agility or jumping class and the host club of each qualifier will choose the grades. It is hoped that a wide range of combined grades will be held to offer everyone the chance to take part in these new competitions.

The Final will consist of 2 rounds (1 Agility and 1 Jumping) for both sizes which will not be timed (max time specified) and double clears will go towards the Final round. In the event of no double clears at either size then dogs with the minimum combined faults will be selected. All double clears will compete in the final jumping round which will be a jumping round against the clock to find winners at each size.

The Finals will be held at Blenheim ATC Agility Show Weekend at West Midlands Showground, Shrewsbury on Saturday 7th September 2013. The Finals will be Judge by Mandy Melville Love.

This competition is indebted the clubs and organisers that host a qualifier. Without their support this competition would not be possible. Please remember to thank them!

Brillo Bounce International Rules

The class must be judged using current Kennel Club rules. The final is open to all grades of dog from 1-7 however each host venue may choose which grades their qualifier is open to.

Class Title: Brillo International Bounce Small Qualifier OR Brillo International Bounce Medium Qualifier.

Class Style: The class must be an agility or jumping class. Each heat must be open to a minimum of two different Grades eg. 1-3 or 1-7 combined. If this gives you difficulty please discuss why you may not be able to offer this.

Qualifiers: Each host venue provides 3 qualifiers at each size to take to the final.

Notes

- 1. Once a dog has qualified (i.e. 3 finalists per heat per size) this eliminates the dog from taking a further finalist place and the next highest placed dog(s) in Brillo International Bounce Qualifier will be invited to the final.*
- 2. Any surrogate handlers must be notified in writing by 29 August 2013 to competition organisers.*
- 3. No amendments after this date and non-advice will disqualify the partnership.*
- 4. Enquiries relating to each heat should be addressed to the organising club.*
- 5. The organisers reserve the right to with hold an invitation to the final without explanation.*
