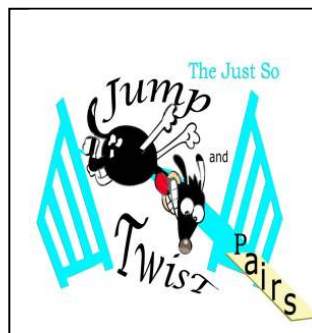

ELIGIBILITY FOR CLASSES

In the following definitions of classes First Prize wins or other prize wins are those gained in standard classes at any Kennel Club licensed Championship Agility, Premier Agility, Open Agility or Limited Agility Shows (i.e. special classes and invitational events excepted). Only a first place with a clear round completed within the course time set by the judge will count towards grade progression.

Agility classes to include contact obstacles and Jumping classes where there are no contact obstacles. With this proviso classes are defined as follows:-

Class Structure. A Class may either be held as a Graded Class or a Combined Class. A Graded Class may be scheduled for one or more consecutive Grades with separate results and awards issued for each grade. A Combined Class may be scheduled for more than one consecutive grade with one overall set of results.

Progression. Progression from each Grade will require one Agility win or three Jumping wins in standard classes at that grade, except that progression from Grade 5 will require 3 wins at Grade 5, one of which must be an agility class. Progression from Grade 6 will require 4 wins at Grade 6, two of which must be agility classes. Results from Combined Classes will only count towards progression from the dog's current grade.

Points Progression. At the handler's discretion a dog may progress up to Grade 4 by winning 100 points at each grade, using the Agility Warrant points scheme, (Regulation K3.c refers), except that there is no requirement for a minimum number of agility points. If this method of progression is selected, the handler must ensure the Show Secretary signs the dog's Agility Record Book at the first show entered at the higher grade. There is no time limit on this progression, however, once a dog has progressed, it cannot return to a previous grade.

Progression on points must be done prior to the closing date of entries. It is not possible to change a grade on points once the entries have closed.

STANDARD CLASSES

Only first prizes and points gained in standard classes at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows may be used for progression through the classes (A dog is only eligible for one grade) In defining the eligibility of the owner or handler for Grade 1, the three jumping wins and points progression referred to in the definition apply only to one dog and not an accumulation of dogs.

GRADE 1 ELEMENTARY	For owners, handlers or dogs which have not gained a first place in an Agility Class or three first places in Jumping Classes at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows N.B. Owners, handlers or dogs previously qualified out of Grade 1 (Elementary) are not eligible for this class.
GRADE 2 STARTERS	Open to dogs which are not eligible for Grades 1,3,4,5,6,7 and have not gained a first place in an Agility Class or three first places in Jumping Classes at Grade 2 Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows, or elected to progress on points from Grade 1. N.B. Owners, handlers or dogs previously qualified out of Grade 2 (Starters) are not eligible for this class.
GRADE 3 GRADUATE	Open to dogs which are not eligible for Grade 1 or 2 or have elected to progress on points from Grade 2 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows and dogs which are not eligible for Grade 4, 5, 6 or 7.
GRADE 4 NOVICE	Open to dogs which have gained a first place in an Agility Class or three first places in Jumping Classes at Grade 3 or elected to progress on points from Grade 3 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Show and are not eligible for Grade 3, 5, 6 or 7.
GRADE 5 INTERMEDIATE	Open to dogs which have gained a first place in an Agility Class or three first places in Jumping Classes at Grade 4 and are not eligible for Grade 3, 4, 6 or 7.
GRADE 6 SENIOR	Open to dogs which have gained a minimum of 3 first places at Grade 5 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows, one of which must have been gained in an Agility (not Jumping) Class, and are not eligible for Grade 3, 4, 5 or 7.
GRADE 7 ADVANCED	Open to dogs which have gained a minimum of 4 first places at Grade 6 Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows, 2 first places must be gained in Agility (not jumping) Classes.
ANYSIZE	Open to dogs not entered in any other class.

SPECIAL CLASSES

The Just So Jump & Twist Pairs - see rules and details on following page.

Special Power & Speed - this class comprises a "Power" section (contacts, long jump, spread etc) followed by a timed "Speed" jumping section. Please note that all LARGE dogs will be able to attempt the jumping, regardless of any faults incurred in the initial power section. For small and medium dogs this will be at the discretion of the relevant judges.

Wins, places and clear rounds in special classes will not count towards agility warrant points or grade progression at Kennel Club shows.



RULES - THE JUST SO JUMP AND TWIST PAIRS

- This class is open to pairs of the same height, small, medium and large.
- It is open to Grades 1-7
- It is a combined class with one set of awards
- One dog will complete an agility course and the other dog a jumping course
- The judge will decide which course will be run first
- The agility course shall consist of twelve obstacles and must include three contacts (they do not have to be three different pieces of contact equipment) and twelve weaves.
- The jumping course shall consist of twelve obstacles one of which must be twelve weaves.
- There will be a changeover box and a baton exchange in the box
- A faulty baton change will incur 100 faults
- The first three pairs from each heat will qualify for the final which will be at Tag Summer Show.
- Once a pair has qualified they may enter other heats for competition but the place in the final will be awarded to the next highest placed pair who has not qualified.
- The sponsors will provide first place trophies and rosettes to 5th place.



RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. Dogs entered at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows must be registered at the Kennel Club in accordance with Kennel Club Regulations for Classification and Registration B, or else registration or transfer of registration must have been applied for. The registration number/authority to compete (ATC) number will be required for each entry.
2. All dogs registered and resident outside the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete (ATC) number before entry to the show/event can be made. All overseas entries without a Kennel Club Registration number or an Authority to Compete number will be returned to the exhibitor/competitor.
3. Entry fees: £2.80 per dog per class (Helping CNDTS members £1.25 per dog per class), Pairs £5.60 (£2.50 CNDTS), NFC free. No refunds will be given after entries have closed.
4. No prize money will be given.
5. Not applicable.
6. The Committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.
7. Only dogs of 18 calendar months of age and over on the first day of the competition are eligible for competition at Kennel Club licensed Agility Tests.
8. Organisers of Open Agility shows may set a capping level on the entries to be accepted in any standard or special class, and may decline entries received after the capping level has been reached. State if specific classes are to be capped and the capping limit. The capping level must be set at a minimum of 250 entries received. There is no maximum level at which a cap may be set.
9. Not for Competition entries will be accepted for dogs aged four calendar months and over. Dogs must be Kennel Club registered with their details recorded on the entry form.
10. No bitch in season is allowed to compete.
11. No person shall carry out punitive correction or harsh handling of a dog at any time within the boundaries of the Show.
12. Dogs must not wear any type of slip, half-slip collar or lead when under test. A flat, close-fitting, leather or webbing collar is permitted, providing the only attachment is a plain identification panel as an integral part of the collar i.e. not attached by a ring.
13. Should a judge be unable to fulfil the appointment to judge the Committee reserves the right to appoint another judge.
14. No competitor shall impugn the decision of the judge or judges.
15. Class 27 "The Sharon Rowe Memorial Power and Speed" is kindly sponsored by JTConsulting.
16. Kennel Club standard marking regulations apply for all standard classes.
17. The heights of the jump obstacles for Anysize Jumping (Special) Class will be set at "Medium", "Small" and "Micro". Handlers may choose at which height their dog runs.
18. The height limit for dogs.
 - (a) Large Dog classes – for dogs measuring over 430 mm (17ins) at the withers.
 - (b) Medium Dog classes – for dogs measure over 350mm (13.75ins) and measuring 430 (17ins) or under at the withers.
 - (c) Small Dog classes – for dogs measuring 350mm (13.75ins) or under at the withers.
19. Judges at an Agility Show may not enter for competition a dog which is recorded in their ownership or part ownership; or handle a dog at the Show at which they are judging. Dogs may be disqualified if proved to have been handled by the scheduled judge's spouse or immediate family, or resident at the same address as the scheduled judge.
20. Withdrawal of dogs from Competition.

A dog shall be withdrawn from competition and removed from the Show if it is:

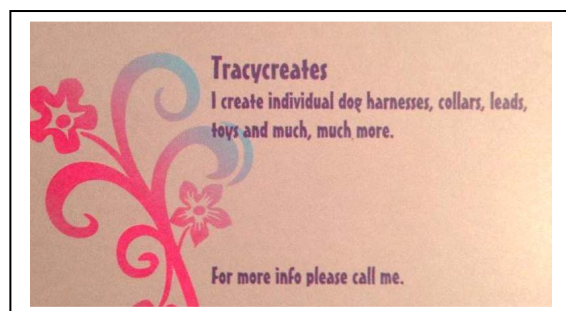
 - a: A bitch in season.
 - b: Suffering from any infectious diseases or contagious disease.
 - c: Interfering with the safety or chance of winning of an opponent.
 - d: Of such temperament or is so much out of hand as to be a danger to the safety of any person or animal.
 - e: Likely to cause suffering to the dog if it continues competing.
21. In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including 25 days before the start of the competition (14th May 2014) shall be counted when entering for any class. For these purposes a competition shall be defined as all classes covered within the same schedule. In the event that a dog becomes eligible for the next grade at a particular show, after the entry for that show has been sent, it is the competitor's responsibility to notify the show secretary at least 14 days before the date of the show. The dog will then be moved into the appropriate class(es) for the next grade. The dog will be moved into the corresponding number of classes as were entered at the lower grade. If there are fewer or no classes available for the next grade the competitor will be offered a refund of their relevant entry fees.

22. Should circumstances so dictate the Society, in consultation with the Judges, may alter arrangements as necessary. Such changes and the circumstances surrounding them will be reported to the Kennel Club.
23. In the event that the show/trial is cancelled due to unforeseen circumstances, the society will refund fees, less reasonably incurred expenses. If the show processor has the provisions to do so, competitors should be refunded in the manner in which they had entered the show. Alternatively the society will refund fees by cheque, to all those that had entered and requested a refund within 1 month of the show date, within 3 months of the show date.
24. Food shall not be carried in the hand or given to a dog in the ring.
25. Should the judge deem a re-run is required, any result and/or faults gained in the previous run must be discounted.
26. Separate entry forms must be completed by each Competitor and must be signed by the Competitor or his authorised agent in accordance with the provisions specified thereon. Entry forms must be accompanied with the appropriate fees.
27. Not applicable.
28. **Competition of Dogs Suffering from Contagious or Infectious Disease** - No dogs suffering from infectious or contagious disease or having been exposed to such disease during the period of 21 days prior to the Competition may compete. Competitors infringing the Regulation will be liable to be fined and/or dealt with under Kennel Club Rule A42.
29. It is the competitors' responsibility to be available for their class and running order. Competitors must run as close to their running order as possible. Failure to do so may be reported to the Kennel Club.
30. **Animals in Event** - No animal other than one officially entered shall be brought into the precincts of the event during its continuance, except any dogs registered to assist the disabled, or dogs required for educational or instructional purposes or by permission of the General Committee. However, at the discretion of the show society, a dog brought to the show by a spectator may be admitted to the precincts of the dog show with the proviso that those in charge of the dog sign a declaration confirming the dog is free from disease and that the dog will be kept under proper control at all times.
31. A practice ring may be available to dogs entered for competition at the show, if space allows. This ring must be supervised by a responsible adult with agility knowledge.
32. A pay on the day class will be held if time permits.
33. **Welfare of Dogs** - An exhibitor (or competitor) whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not knowingly put their dogs' health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. A breach of this Regulation may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rules and Regulations.
34. Handlers working more than one dog in a class must ensure that the dogs compete in the sequence in which they are drawn. Failure to do so will result in elimination.
35. Please clean up after your dog and place mess in the bins provided. Anyone knowingly not doing so may be asked to leave the venue and forfeit any remaining classes.

Dogs in Cars on Hot Days

Your dog is vulnerable and at risk during hot weather and the Kennel Club offers the following guidance to help you through the do's and don'ts travelling to and whilst at KC licensed events.

When travelling to a show please take a moment to consider whether the route to the show is on a busy holiday route and leave earlier to avoid increased time in traffic jams. If your vehicle is not air-conditioned seriously consider whether travelling to the show is a good idea at all.

The vehicle should be as fully ventilated as possible and plenty of stops should be taken with lots of water to drink.

Ensure your dog is not sitting in full sunlight. There should be plenty of free flowing air around the dog.

Keep the dog in the shade – take your own shade for example a large umbrella and always have plenty of water available to drink so your dog stays well hydrated.

Avoid your dog taking part in unnecessary exertion, or from standing in exposed sunlight for extended lengths of time. Remember, if you feel hot your dog is likely to feel much hotter and dehydrated, and this could lead to dire results. Please look after your dog's welfare.

DIRECTIONS:

PLEASE DO NOT USE YOUR SAT NAV. FOLLOW THE DIRECTIONS AS BELOW. YOU WILL NEED TO ALLOW AT LEAST 15 MINUTES FROM WHEN YOU TURN OFF THE A45 TO THE VENUE AS IT IS A LONG MAINLY SINGLE TRACK ROAD.

From M1 (Coming from the North)

- Come off of the motorway at Junction 18. At the roundabout turn towards DIRFT
- Next roundabout turn left
- Next roundabout go straight over (Eddie Stobart on your left)
- Next roundabout turn left onto A5.
- Follow this road up into KILSBY (nb adhere to the 30 mph SPEED CAMERAS!)
- At the roundabout follow the A361 (to the right) through Kilsby.
- Once out of the village go over the M45 bridge, then take 1st RIGHT signed to BARBY.
- Follow this road to the crossroads, go straight over towards the A45. (Watch out for the bridge over the canal. Narrow)
- At the A45 turn RIGHT. Go along here, you will pass the sign for Onley Prison on your right. Afterwards...
- Look out for green sign on the right which says FARM ACCESS, take that right turn by some barn conversions.
- Follow the driveway about ½ mile up to the farm, at the top turn left into the yard. Welcome to Onley Grounds Equestrian Complex!

From M1 (Coming from the South)

- Leave the M1 at junction 17 onto the M45
- At the end of the M45 go round the roundabout and back onto the M45. The exit junction can only be accessed southbound
- Leave the M45 at the first exit, signed A45
- Turn right at the exit roundabout onto the A45.
- Immediately after the Grandborough turning to the right, turn left by the barn conversions
- Follow the driveway about ½ mile up to the farm, at the top turn left into the yard. Welcome to Onley Grounds Equestrian Complex!

From M4

- Leave the M4 at junction 13 onto the A34 north (Oxford)
- Eventually, join the M40 (junction 9) to go north (first exit off of the A34/M40 roundabout)
- Leave the M40 at junction 11 (Banbury), (travel towards Banbury)
- At the Tesco roundabout, turn right onto the A423 (Southam)
- On the outskirts of Southam, turn right onto the A426 (Rugby and Dunchurch)
- In Dunchurch, at the traffic lights, turn right onto the A45
- Immediately after the Grandborough turning to the right, turn left by the barn conversions
- Follow the driveway about ½ mile up to the farm, at the top turn left into the yard. Welcome to Onley Grounds Equestrian Complex!

From M5

- Leave the M5 at junction 9 onto the A46 eastbound (Ashchurch, Evesham, Stratford). Be aware of your speed - numerous fixed and mobile speed cameras!
- Numerous roundabouts, but stay on the A46
- Eventually (on the Kenilworth Bypass), exit onto the A45 towards Coventry Airport, Ryton, Rugby (again, be aware of your speed, numerous fixed and mobile speed cameras)
- Join the M45 (DO NOT GO THROUGH DUNCHURCH!)
- Take the first exit off of the M45 onto the A45, and at the exit roundabout, turn right onto the A45
- Immediately after the Grandborough turning to the right, turn left by the barn conversions
- Follow the driveway about ½ mile up to the farm, at the top turn left into the yard. Welcome to Onley Grounds Equestrian Complex!
