## ELIGIBILITY AND DEFINITION OF CLASSES

In the following definitions of classes First Prizes or other prize wins are those gained in standard classes at any Kennel Club licensed Championship Agility, Premier Agility, Open Agility or Limited Agility Shows (i.e. Limited Agility Shows, special classes and invitational events excepted). Only a first place with a clear round completed within the course time set by the judge will count towards grade progression.

Standard classes may be scheduled for Agility Shows, as Agility classes or Jumping classes. All standard classes must contain the Weaving Poles obstacle. Standard Agility classes must contain the following elements: "A Ramp", Dog Walk and See-Saw. With this proviso classes are defined as follows:-

### **Class Structure.**

A Class may either be held as a Graded Class or a Combined Class. A Graded Class may be scheduled for one or more consecutive Grades with separate results and awards issued for each grade. A Combined Class may be scheduled for more than one consecutive grade with one overall set of results.

### **Progression.**

Progression from each Grade will require one Agility win or three Jumping wins in standard classes at that grade, except that progression from Grade 5 will require 3 wins at Grade 5, one of which must be an agility class. Progression from Grade 6 will require 4 wins at Grade 6, two of which must be Agility classes. Results from Combined Classes will only count towards progression from the dog's current grade.

### **Points Progression.**

At the handler's discretion a dog may progress up to Grade 4 by winning 100 points at each grade, using the Agility Warrant points scheme (Regulation K3.c refers) except that there is no requirement for a minimum number of agility points. If this method of progression is selected, the handler must ensure the Show Secretary signs the dog's Agility Record Book at the first show entered at the higher grade. There is no time limit on this progression, however, once a dog has progressed, it cannot return to a previous grade. Progression on points must be done prior to the closing date of entries. It is not possible to change a grade on points once the entries have closed.

## **STANDARD CLASSES**

Only first prizes and points gained in standard classes at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows may be used for progression through the classes. (A dog is only eligible for one grade). In defining the eligibility of the owner or handler for Grade 1, the three jumping wins and points progression referred to in the definition apply only to one dog and not an accumulation of dogs.

Grade 1 (Elementary) For owners, handlers or dogs which have not gained a first place in an Agility Class or 3 first places in Jumping Classes at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows. N.B. Owners, handlers or dogs previously qualified out of Grade 1 (Elementary) are not eligible for this class.

Grade 2 (Starters) Open to dogs which are not eligible for Grades 1,3,4,5,6,7, and have not gained a first place in an Agility Class or three first places in Jumping Classes at Grade 2 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows, or elected to progress on points from Grade 1. N.B. Owners, handlers or dogs previously qualified out of Grade 2 (Starters) are not eligible for this class.

Grade 3 (Graduate) Open to dogs which are not eligible for Grade 1 or 2 or have elected to progress on points from Grade 2 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows and dogs which are not eligible for Grade 4, 5, 6 or 7.

Grade 4 (Novice) Open to dogs which have gained a first place in an Agility Class or 3 first places in Jumping Classes at Grade 3 or elected to progress on points from Grade 3 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows and are not eligible for Grade 3, 5, 6 or 7.

Grade 5 (Intermediate) Open to dogs which have gained a first place in an Agility Class or 3 first places in Jumping Classes at Grade 4 and are not eligible for Grade 3, 4, 6 or 7.

Grade 6 (Senior) Open to dogs which have gained a minimum of 3 first places at Grade 5 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows, one of which must have been gained in an Agility (not Jumping) Class, and are not eligible for Grade 3, 4, 5 or 7.

Grade 7 (Advanced) Open to dogs which have gained a minimum of 4 first places at Grade 6 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows, 2 first places must be gained in Agility (not Jumping) Classes.

Special Classes Special Anysize Jumping Open to all dogs not entered in any other classes. Jumps will be set at 450mm (Medium height) for LARGE dogs, 350mm (small height) for MEDIUM dogs and less than 350mm (Micro Height).for SMALL dogs. This class will not include weaves, tyre, long jump, spread or collapsible tunnel. All heights of dogs will compete against each other over the same course with one set of awards. . Standard marking will apply Wins, places and clear rounds in this class will not count towards agility warrant points or grade progression at any Kennel Club shows.

Special Veteran Jumping Open to all dogs not entered in any other classes. Dogs must be 8 years or over on the day of the show. Standard marking will apply. The course will be flowing without weaves, tyre, long jump, spread or collapsible tunnel. Jumps will be set at 450mm (Medium height) for LARGE dogs, 350mm (small height) for MEDIUM dogs and less than 350mm for SMALL dogs. Wins, places and clear rounds in this class will not count towards agility warrant points or grade progression at any Kennel Club shows.



## **Crufts Large Novice ABC Agility Stakes (Special) 2016 - 2017**

### **Eligibility**

This competition is a special agility competition open to all dogs excluding Border Collies, Working Sheepdogs and any of their crosses. In the event of a dispute over the parentage of a dog, a decision will be left to the judge's discretion.

Those dogs eligible to compete in competition for large dogs are those measuring over 430 mm (1 foot 5 inches) at the withers.

Dogs should be eligible to compete at Grade 1 - 5 at the time of qualifying for the semi-final. Any subsequent wins gained by the dog will not alter its eligibility to compete in the semi-final or final.

### **Competition Rules**

The competition will be held under Kennel Club rules and regulations for Agility and any handler entering the competition will be deemed to have agreed to abide by these rules and regulations. Standard rules will apply and all equipment used shall be of a standard size for that height category.

The semi-final and final will consist of one round of agility competition and one round of jumping competition. The winner of the Large Novice ABC Stakes will be the dog and handler with the least combined faults in the fastest combined time calculated over the two rounds of the final.

Qualifying: - There will be 10 qualifying shows throughout the year.

The first 10 placed dogs in each heat will have the following points awarded:

1st place = 10 points, 2nd place = 9 points etc. down to 10th place = 1 point.

Qualifying points will be awarded down to 10th even if the show does not award class places down to 10th.

If a qualified handler or dog is unable/unfit to attend the final, reserves will be taken from dog/s with the highest number of points from the heats which have/has not qualified.

The top two of the top ten breeds, with the most points, will be invited to a semi-final at Discover Dogs 2016. (20 dogs in total)

The first ten highest placed dogs at the semi-final will be invited to compete in the finals to be held at Crufts Dog Show, NEC Birmingham in March 2017.





## Triple Team Qualifier Rules

- Team relay open to small, medium and large dogs, KC Grades 1-7.
- Standard KC rules and marking apply. Elimination = 100f. Once a dog has been eliminated there will be no continuous marking of that dog, however other dogs in the team can incur further faults and eliminations.
- Teams will consist of three dogs and three handlers, plus a maximum of two reserves, any combination of heights. Heights must be stated on entry form.
- Small and Medium dogs will compete over KC small height, large dogs will compete over KC large height.
- The class will be a team relay over similar courses consisting of 10 obstacles (e.g. mirror image), the courses must contain weaves and an A Frame. Dog walk and Seesaw must not be used.
- Dog one and three must compete over the left hand course and dog two must compete over the right hand course. Where a team consists of a different height dog, this dog must run second in the team. (e.g. a team of a small, medium and large, the different height dog is the large and the small and medium runs over small height)
- Teams will be issued with running orders it is at the judge's discretion if these should be strictly adhered to. Teams should be available to run when the heights at set to suit their team. Team runs should take priority over individual runs.
- Handlers may be entered into more than one team; dogs may only be entered into one team. Dogs can be entered as reserves in other teams but may only run in one team both in the heats and final.
- Baton changes must be hand to hand and take place in the designated area allocated by the judge, the baton must remain in this designated area during the teams run. The baton must not be thrown or dropped. Incorrect baton changes will incur 50f.
- Judges decision is final.
- 1st and 2nd placed teams will at qualifying heats will qualify for the final at Agilitynuts in September 2016, held at Thorsby Park, Ollerton. In the event that the teams in 1st and/or 2nd have previously qualified, then the qualifying place(s) will be given to the next highest placed team(s), until the two qualifying places have been allocated.
- Only dogs and handlers entered as part of the team or reserves at the qualifying heat will be able to compete at the final.

From: - Headlands Road/Wallbank Road – **TURN LEFT** on to A5143 Bridge Lane. At the **ROUNDAABOUT** take 1<sup>st</sup> Exit on to A5102 Bramhall Lane South, 1 mile **TURN RIGHT** on to Carrwood Road, ½ mile **TURN LEFT** on to Manor Road. At the **ROUNDAABOUT** take the 2<sup>nd</sup> exit on to A5149 Station Road, about ½ mile Keep **STRAIGHT** on to Queens Road. Total distance: 2.4 MILES. Approx. journey time: 10 MINS

**Directions from Preston Bolton M61/M60:-** Leave **M60 at Jct 2**, at the end of the slip road **straight across roundabout 4<sup>th</sup> exit** (Cheadle/Gatley). At the Lights **Turn Left** (Councillor Lane) (Carpet Right on the Corner.) (Ignore sign no access to Bramhall Lane) At **3<sup>rd</sup> set Traffic Lights Turn Right** (Bramhall Lane) (Passing Lidl on the right and Welcome to Adswood). **Straight on at small roundabout at next large roundabout** (Bramhall Park on your right) take the **1<sup>st</sup> exit** onto Bridge Lane. At the next **roundabout take the 4<sup>th</sup> exit** onto **Wallbank Road**. This is a private road take care (rough road) - the venue is on your right at the bottom of this lane the entrance gate is **12' wide**.

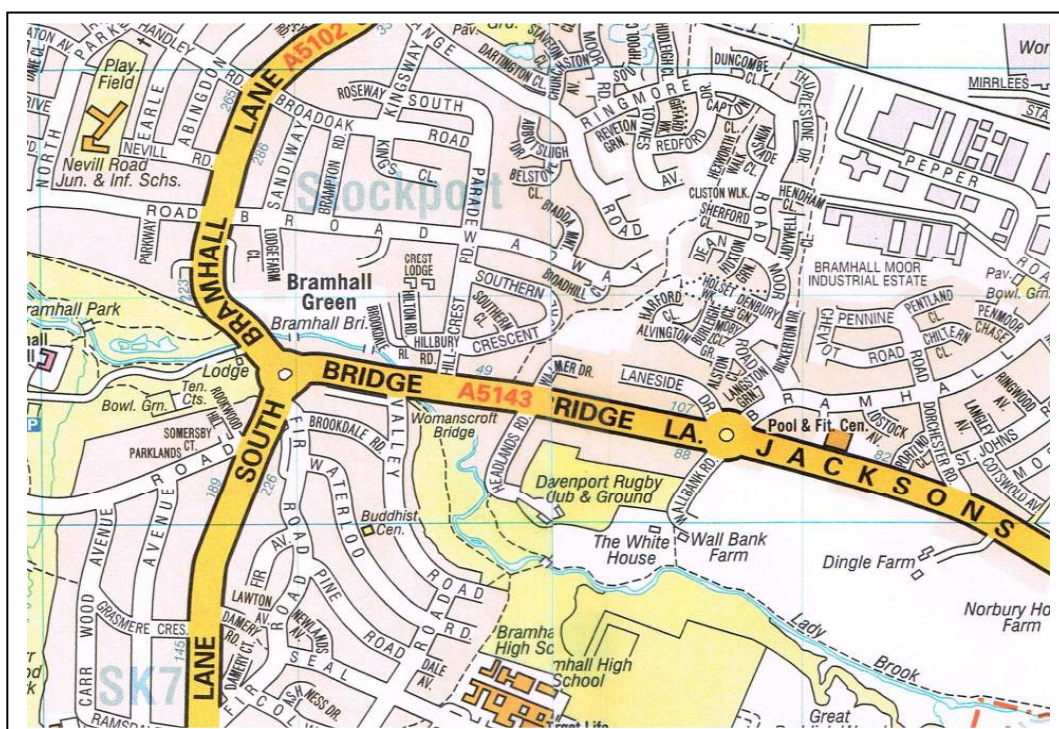
**Directions from Leeds M62/M60:-** Leave **M60 at Jct 26** Crooklley

Way at the **roundabout take the 2<sup>nd</sup> exit** onto St Marys Way. Go **straight on at THREE sets of Lights** then get into left hand lane and **filter LEFT** at the **next Lights**. Get into the right hand land and at **next lights go straight across (A6)** (diagonally) (The Blossoms pub will be on the left hand corner facing you) onto Bramhall Lane. **Through 2 sets Traffic Lights, straight on at small roundabout, at next large roundabout** (Bramhall Park on your right) take the **1<sup>st</sup> exit** onto Bridge Lane. At the next **roundabout take the 4<sup>th</sup> exit** onto **Wallbank Road**. This is a private road take care (rough road) - the venue is on your right at the bottom of this lane the entrance gate is **12' wide**.

**Directions from M56:-** Leave **M56 at Jct 6**, at end of slip road **roundabout take 3<sup>rd</sup> exit** (A538 Wilmslow) Wilmslow Road, at the **Lights straight through**, – Go through Airport Runway Tunnel. At **roundabout Straight on 2<sup>nd</sup> exit** (Wilmslow) Altrincham Road A538, pass Holliday Inn. At the roundabout straight across **2<sup>nd</sup> exit**, pass Boddington Arms on the right. At lights turn **Left** (Alderley Road) (sign Handforth Dean), next set of **Lights Straight Through**, to a **roundabout 3<sup>rd</sup> exit** (Bollin Link) (sign Manchester) next **roundabout 1<sup>st</sup> exit** (A34 Wilmslow by Pass) Ford Showrooms on your right. At next **Roundabout Straight Across 2<sup>nd</sup> exit**, next **Roundabout 2<sup>nd</sup> exit** (sign Bramhall) next **Roundabout 3<sup>rd</sup> exit** under Airport Link onto Airport Eastern Link. Next **Roundabout 1<sup>st</sup> exit** (Bramhall), next **roundabout 2<sup>nd</sup> exit** Bramhall Village, go under railway bridge & pass the station on the right carry on to **Large roundabout Turn Right 2<sup>nd</sup> exit** onto Bridge Lane. At the next **roundabout take the 4<sup>th</sup> exit** onto **Wallbank Road**. This is a private road take care (rough road) - the venue is on your right at the bottom of this lane the entrance gate is **12' wide**.

**Directions from Buxton A6:-** At the Rising Sun Pub **Turn Left** at the **Lights** onto (A523 Macclesfield Road). Continue to a junction passing a large pub on the right (The Five Ways). At the **Lights turn Right** onto (Dean Lane A5143) **straight through at Lights and mini Roundabout**. At the **large roundabout Turn Left 1<sup>st</sup> exit** (it is a tight turn) onto **Wallbank Road**. This is a private road take care (rough road) - the venue is on your right at the bottom of this lane the entrance gate is **12' wide**.

**Directions from Macclesfield:-** - Go through **pedestrian roundabout in Poynton** (passing the church on the Left) heading for Hazel Grove. At the **lights Turn Left** onto (Dean Lane A5143). (Choppy on the right and Summer Palace on the Left) **Straight through at Lights and mini Roundabout**. At the **large roundabout Turn Left 1<sup>st</sup> exit** (it is a tight turn) onto **Wallbank Road**. This is a private road take care (rough road) - the venue is on your right at the bottom of this lane the entrance gate is **12' wide**.





1. Dogs entered at Kennel Club licensed Agility shows must be registered at the Kennel Club in accordance with Kennel Club Regulations for Classification & Registration B, or else registration or transfer of registration must have been applied for. The registration number/Authority to Compete (ATC) number will be required for each entry.
2. All dogs registered & resident outside the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete (ATC) number before entry to the show/event can be made. All overseas entries without a Kennel Club Registration number or an Authority to Compete number will be returned to the exhibitor/competitor
3. Entry fees are as detailed on the Entry Form. Entries charged at **£3.00** per class. Working club members **£1.00** per class.
4. Prizes – no monetary prizes are on offer. Awards for each class are listed in the awards section of the schedule.
5. How can entries be made, entry form and internet.
6. The Committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.
7. Only dogs of 18 calendar months of age and over on the day of competition are eligible for competition at Kennel Club licensed Agility shows.
8. Not For Competition entries will be accepted for dogs aged four calendar months or over. Dogs must be Kennel Club registered with their details recorded on the entry form.
9. No bitch in season is allowed to compete.
10. No person shall carry out punitive correction or harsh handling of a dog at any time within the boundaries of the show.
11. Dogs must not wear any type of slip, half-slip collar or lead when under test. A flat, close fitting, leather or webbing collar is permitted, providing the only attachment is a plain identification panel, as an integral part of the collar i.e. not attached by a ring.
12. Should a judge be unable to fulfil the appointment to judge the Committee reserves the right to appoint another judge?
13. No competitor shall impugn the decision of the judge or judges.
14. Sponsorship - Sponsors for the show will be listed on the schedule as to which classes they are sponsoring.
15. Detailed rules of qualifiers are on a separate sheet.
16. Kennel Club standard marking regulations apply for all standard classes.
17. Anysize Jumping hurdles will be set on small. Veterans Jumping hurdles will be set at medium, small and micro, competitors may choose which height to do.
18. Height limit for dogs:
  - a) Large dogs classes– for dogs measuring over 430mm (1ft 5ins) at the withers.
  - b) Medium dogs classes – for dogs measuring over 350mm (1ft 1.75ins) and measuring 430mm (1ft 5ins) or under at the withers.
  - c) Small dogs classes – for dogs measuring 350mm (1ft 1.75ins) or under at the withers.
19. Judges at an Agility show may not enter for competition a dog which is recorded in their ownership or part ownership; or handle a dog at the show at which they are judging. Dogs may be disqualified if proved to have been handled by the scheduled judge's spouse of immediate family, or resident at the same address as the scheduled judge.
20. Removal of dogs from competition:- Following discussion between the show management and/or a veterinary surgeon, a dog shall be prevented from competing and/or removed from the Show if it is:-
  - a) A bitch which is in season.
  - b) Suffering from any infectious disease or contagious disease.
  - c) Interfering with the safety or chances of winning of an opponent.
  - d) Of such temperament or is so much out of control as to be a danger to the safety of any person or other animal.
  - e) Likely to cause suffering to the dog if it continues competing. The circumstances of such a removal shall be recorded in the Competition/show Incident Book and submitted to the Kennel Club.
21. In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to & including 25 days before the start of the competition (**22nd April 2016**), shall be counted when entering for any class. For these purposes a competition shall be defined as all classes covered within the same schedule. In the event that a dog becomes eligible for the next grade at a particular show, after the entry for that show has been sent, it is the competitor's responsibility to notify **Paul Sensky ☎ 07760 252 992 or Email: paul.sensky@longhedge.co.uk at least 14 days (30th April 2016)** before the date of the show. The dog should then be moved into the appropriate class(s) for the next grade. The dog must be moved into the corresponding number of classes as were entered at the lower grade. If there are fewer or no classes available for the next grade the competitor should be offered a refund of the relevant entry fees.
22. Should circumstances so dictate the Society, in consultation with the Judges may alter arrangements as necessary. Such changes and the circumstances surrounding them must be reported to the Kennel Club
23. In the event that the show is cancelled due to unforeseen circumstances, the club will refund fees, less reasonably incurred expenses, on receipt of a Stamped addressed envelope submitted within 1 month of the show date. No refunds after the closing date of the show, except in exceptional circumstances. No refunds will be given in the event of incorrect monies being submitted. It is the competitor's responsibility to check the paperwork before submission. Bounced cheques will be charged for. All entry forms must contain the signature of the owner and the dog registration number before a dog is eligible to take part in the show.
24. Except for mobility aids, nothing shall be carried in the hand while the dog is under test and food shall not be given to a dog whilst in the ring.
25. Should the judge deem a re-run is required, any result and/or faults gained in the previous run must be discounted
26. Separate entry forms must be completed by each owner and must be signed by the owner or his authorised agent in accordance with the provisions specified thereon. Entry forms must be accompanied by the appropriate fees.
27. Competition of Dogs suffering from Contagious or Infectious Disease – No dogs suffering from infectious or contagious disease or having been exposed to such disease during the period of 21 days prior to the Competition may compete. Competitors infringing the Regulation will be liable to be fined and/or dealt with under Kennel Club Rule A11.
28. It is the competitor's responsibility to be available for their class and running order. Competitors must run as close to their running order as possible. Failure to do so may be reported to the Kennel Club.
29. **Animals in Events** – No animal other than one officially entered shall be brought into the precincts of the event during its continuance, except any dogs registered to assist the disabled, or dogs required for educational or instructional purposes or by permission of the General Committee. However, at the discretion of the show society, a dog brought to the show by a spectator may be admitted into the precincts of the show, with the proviso that those in charge of the dog sign a declaration confirming the dog is free from disease and that the dog will be kept under proper control at all times.
30. A pay on the day class may be held if time permits.
31. A practice ring may be available to dogs entered in the show, if time and space allows, supervised by a responsible adult with Agility Knowledge
32. **WELFARE OF DOGS** – A competitor whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club Licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not knowingly put their dogs' health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. A breach of this Regulation may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rules and Regulations
33. All dogs are entered at their owners risk & whilst every care will be taken, the High Peak Dog Training Society will not take responsibility for the loss, damage or injury to dogs, people or property whilst at this show.
34. All camping units must be equipped with their own fire fighting equipment.
35. Parents are responsible for the behaviour of their children at all times whilst on the show venue. No bikes near the ring
36. All generators are to be switched off at 8.30pm each evening.
37. NO CAMP FIRES & no disposable barbecues are to be placed on the grass. Please be careful when you dispose of your barbecue waste & DO NOT put hot disposable barbecues in the skip. Do not empty Hot Water onto the grass
38. Only two dogs per handler off the lead at any time.
39. Competitors are responsible for cleaning up after their dogs. Those failing to do so will be asked to leave the show.

**DOGS VEHICLES ON HOT DAYS** - Your dog is vulnerable and at risk during hot weather and the Kennel Club offers the following guidance to help you through the do's and don'ts travelling to and whilst at KC Licensed Events.

- When travelling to a show please take a moment to consider whether the route to the show is a busy holiday rout, and leave earlier to avoid increased time in traffic jams
- If your vehicle is not air-conditioned seriously consider whether travelling to the show is a good idea at all.
- The vehicle should be as fully ventilated as possible, and plenty of stops should be taken with lots of water available to drink
- Ensure your dog is not sitting in full sunlight. There should be plenty of free flowing air around the dog.
- Keep the dog in the shade-take your own shade-for example a large umbrella and always have plenty of water to drink so your dog stays well hydrated.
- Avoid your dog taking part in unnecessary exertion, or standing in exposed sunlight for extended lengths of time.
- Remember, if you feel hot your dog is likely to feel much hotter and dehydrated, and this could lead to dire results. Please look after your dog's welfare.
