SHOW INFORMATION

Trophies and Rosettes: Trophies to 3rd place in all combined classes, Trophies in graded classes dependant on entries, minimum 1st place. Rosettes to at least 10% of entries. Clear round rosettes in all classes. Trophies and Rosettes in qualifiers and/or sponsored classes are as per the instructions of the sponsors.

Measuring: There will be **no** scheduled measuring sessions during the weekend.

Welfare of Dogs: A competitor whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not knowingly put their dogs health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. A breach of these regulations may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rules and Regulations.

Dogs in Cars: Your dog is vulnerable and AT RISK if left in a vehicle in high temperatures and even on days considered as slightly warm. Please take care of your dog. If your dog is found to be at risk, **forcible entry to your vehicle may be necessary without liability for the damage caused.**

Camping: Camping is limited and will be allocated. Camping spaces will be at least 9m x 9m in size. Only one unit and/or vehicle per camping space, additional vehicles will be asked to park in day parking area. All camping units must have a fire extinguisher and/or bucket of water available.

Please note: We are unable to provide shower facilities at this show

Vehicles: Please be aware that the entry to the venue and the camping fields are narrow so care must be taken with large vehicles and caravans particularly in the event of bad weather. NADTC accept no responsibility to damage to vehicles or caravans howsoever caused.

Please ensure all vehicles have a tow-ring, as in the event of bad weather vehicles may have to be towed. Please obey all instructions from stewards concerning parking, traffic movement and camping.

No overnight camping/sleeping in cars is allowed in the car parking area.

Exercise Area & Dog Waste: Exercise areas will be clearly marked. Please be considerate to other people. No more than two dogs off lead per handler.

All dogs are to be kept on lead around the show, including car parks and camping area, except when competing in the ring or in the designated exercise areas.

Please clean up after your dogs in **all** areas of the venue, including exercise areas.

By entering the show you indicate acceptance of these conditions. Failure to comply with any of these conditions may result in the expulsion from this and exclusion from future NADTC shows and may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rules and Regulations.

Eligibility and Schedule of Classes

This classification applies to competitions for large, medium and small dogs.

In the following definitions of classes First Prize or other prize wins are those gained in standard classes at any Kennel Club Open licensed Open Agility Shows (i.e. Limited Agility Shows, special classes and invitation events excepted). Only a first place with a clear round will count towards grade progression.

Agility classes to include contact points and Jumping classes where there are not contact obstacles. With this proviso classes are defined as follows:-

Class Structure. A Class may either be held as a Graded Class or a Combined Class. A Graded Class may be scheduled for one or more consecutive Grades with separate results and awards issued for each grade. A Combined Class may be scheduled for more than one consecutive grade with one overall set of results.

Progression. Progression from each Grade will require one Agility win or three Jumping wins at that grade, except that progression from Grade 6 will require 4 wins at Grade 6, two of which must be agility classes. Results from Combined Classes will only count towards progression from the dog's current grade.

Points Progression. At the handler's discretion a dog may progress up to Grade 5 by winning 75 points at each grade, using the Agility Warrant points scheme, Regulation K3.c refers, except that there is no requirement for a minimum number of agility points. If this method of progression is selected, the handler must ensure the Show Secretary signs the dog's Agility Record Book at the first show entered at the higher grade. There is no time limit on this progression, however, once a dog has progressed, it cannot return to a previous grade.

Eligibility and Definition of Classes

Only First prizes and points gained in standard classes at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows may be used for progression through the classes. (A dog is only eligible for one grade). In defining the edibility of the owner or handler for Grade 1, the three jumping wins and points progression referred to in the definition apply only to one dog and not an accumulation of dogs.

Grade 1 (Elementary) For owners, handlers or dogs which have not gained a first place in an Agility Class or three first places in Jumping Classes at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows. *N.B. Owners, handlers or dogs previously qualified out of Grade 1, (Elementary) are not eligible for this class.*

Grade 2 (Starters) Open to dogs which are not eligible for Grades 1, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7 and have not gained a first place in an Agility Class or three first places in Jumping Classes at Grade 2 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows, or elected to progress on points from Grade 1. *N.B. Owners, handlers or dogs previously qualified out of Grade 2 (Starters) are not eligible for this class.*

Grade 3 (Graduate) Open to dogs which are not eligible for Grade 1 or 2 or have elected to progress on points from Grade 2 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows and dogs which are not eligible for Grade 4,5,6 or 7

Grade 4 (Novice) Open to dogs which have gained a first place in an Agility Class or three first places in Jumping Classes at Grade 3 or elected to progress on points from Grade 3 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows and are not eligible for Grade 3, 5, 6 or 7.

Grade 5 (Intermediate) Open to dogs which have gained a first place in an Agility Class or three first places in Jumping Classes at Grade 4 or elected to progress on points from Grade 4 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows and are not eligible for Grade 3, 4, 6 or 7.

Grade 6 (Senior) Open to dogs which have gained a first place in an Agility Class or three first places in Jumping Classes at Grade 5 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows and are not eligible for Grade 3, 4, 5 or 7.

Grade 7 (Advanced) Open to dogs which have gained a minimum of 4 first places at Grade 6 at Kennel Club Licensed Agility Shows, 2 first places must be gained in Agility (not Jumping) Classes.

Championship Class (Kennel Club Championship Agility Certificate)

Open to dogs having qualified to compete in Grade 7. To consist of 2 qualifying rounds of Standard Kennel Club Classes, 1 Agility Class and 1 Jumping Class and a final round of Agility to be held at the same Show.

Allsorts (Special Class)

Open to all sizes of dog **that are not entered for any other class** at this show . These classes are intended for dogs/handlers new to competition and those dogs unable to compete at their full height. No weaving poles, tyre or contact equipment will be used and jump heights will be set at 350mm for large dogs and no higher than 250mm for small/medium dogs. The courses will be simple and flowing.

Veteran (Special Class)

Open to all sizes of dog, BC/WSD aged 10 years or older, ABCs aged 8 years or older, **that are not entered for any other class** at this show. These classes are intended for still active elderly dogs unable to compete at their full height. No weaving poles, tyre or contact equipment will be used and jump heights will be set at 350mm for large dogs and no higher than 250mm for small/medium dogs. The courses will be simple and flowing.



All events will be judged under the appropriate Kennel Club regulations H & H (1) in force at the time of the event. Competitors entering any competition will be deemed to have agreed to abide by these regulations.

If the entry for the heat exceeds the Kennel Club limit for a judge in a day, then the class will be equally split and another judge appointed for the second part. Qualifiers and reserves from that heat will be taken in equal proportion from each part, giving the total number originally required from that heat. Rosettes and awards remain unchanged if the heat is split.

Dogs entered in any heats must be eligible for the competition entered. Judges retain the right to check the height of any dog or ask to see the height stated in the Kennel Club Record Book.

Competitors can qualify for any Olympia final but it must be with different dogs. The first final a handler qualifies a dog for will be the final that particular dog competes in at Olympia.

THE KENNEL CLUB OLYMPIA LARGE DOG AGILITY STAKES

Competitors may enter more than one dog in a heat. Competitors may qualify more than one dog for the semi-final. Only one dog may qualify for the final (the first dog qualified at the semi-final). Once a dog has qualified for the final/semi-final, further heats may be entered for competition although any placings in these further heats will not affect the dog's eligibility for the final/semi-finals.

The first five previously unqualified placed dogs from each heat will go forward to one of the two semi-finals at the City of Birmingham Show at Stoneleigh. The first eighteen dogs from each semi-final will qualify for the final at Olympia.

The thirty-six dogs who qualify for Olympia will be invited to compete in a further semi-final at Olympia. The top ten highest placed dogs in the Olympia semi final will qualify for the final at Olympia.

Those dogs eligible to compete in competition for Large dogs are those measuring over 430 mm (1 foot 5 inches) at the withers.

This competition will be classified as combined Grade 6 & 7 and judged under the Kennel Club regulations for standard classes.



DFS CRUFTS Singles Agility Competition

These competitions will be scheduled as a combined class for grades 6 & 7 for all height categories. There will be a separate qualifying competition for each height category.

There will be 12 separate heats for each height category, (small, medium, large) held at Kennel Club licensed shows, throughout the country.

The first 10 placed dogs in each heat will have the following points awarded:

1st place = 10 points, 2nd place = 9 points etc. down to 10th place = 1 point.

In the event of awards not going down to 10th place the Show Secretary should record the top ten places excluding eliminated dogs and send the results to the DFS Crufts Office at the Kennel Club within 14 days of the show.

Competitors may enter more than one dog in a heat. Competitors may qualify more than one dog for the final.

The 16 large dogs with the highest accumulation of points will be invited to compete in the DFS CRUFTS Singles Large Agility Final at DFS CRUFTS 2011.

The 10 medium dogs with the highest accumulation of points will be invited to compete in the DFS CRUFTS Singles Medium Agility Final at DFS CRUFTS 2011.

The 10 small dogs with the highest accumulation of points will be invited to compete in the DFS CRUFTS Singles Small Agility Final at DFS CRUFTS 2011.



DFS CRUFTS Team Agility Competition

This is an Agility competition and must include at least two items of contact equipment.

This is a team relay event and a suitable baton should be used which must remain behind the start line at all times. When the dog/handler returns to the start/finish, there will be a baton change between the handlers. No part of the next dog/handler must be over the start line at the change over; failure to observe this will incur a penalty of twenty faults.

These competitions will be scheduled as a combined class for grades 1 to 7 for all height categories. There will be a separate qualifying competition for each height category.

There will be up to 8 separate heats for the large height category and 9 heats for small and medium category held at Kennel Club licensed shows, throughout the country.

Each team will consist of 4 dogs, with 4 handlers from the same height category.

The winners of each heat will be invited to DFS CRUFTS 2011 to compete in the Small, Medium and Large Finals. In the event that the winning team or club in a heat has already qualified for the final then the highest placed unqualified team in that heat will be invited to the final at CRUFTS. Only dogs entered as a reserve at the qualifying event will be permitted to compete in the final should a change of dog be necessary.

This event is open to Kennel Club Registered Clubs with an interest in agility, all team members must be members of the club at the time of qualifying for the DFS CRUFTS Teams Final. Clubs may only qualify 1 (one) team in each height category for the final at DFS CRUFTS 2011.

Once a handler or dog has run for a Kennel Club Registered Club in a DFS CRUFTS Team Agility event they cannot run for another Kennel Club Registered Club in the DFS CRUFTS Team Agility event at the same height category during the qualifying year.

Large Dogs Combined Agility Grades 3, 4 & 5 Competition Rules

The “**Dog Vegas Qualifier**” is a competition for Large dogs, eligible for Grades 3, 4 & 5.

There are **ten qualifying heats**. The top 5 dogs from each heat (top 3 if the heat is split into 2 parts), will qualify for the “**£ Dog Vegas £**”**Grand Final** comprising of approx 50 at the August Dog Vegas show in 2010.

1. This class must be judged under the appropriate Kennel Club Rules in force at the time of the competition.
2. *If the entry for a heat exceeds the KC limit for a judge in a day then the class will be equally and randomly split and another judge appointed for the second part.*
3. All competitors entering the class will be deemed to have agreed to abide by the rules of the Kennel Club and the specific regulations governing this class.
4. The competition is open to Kennel Club registered dogs eligible to compete at Large Height Grade 3, 4 & 5.
5. Handlers may enter more than one dog in the competition and may qualify more than one dog for the final event.
6. Once a dog has qualified for the final it may enter further heats, as long as it is still eligible for Grade 3, 4 or 5. Handlers who have already qualified their dog for the final must report this fact to the appropriate Show Secretary before running in the class. If the already qualified dog then qualifies again, the place will be awarded to the highest placed unqualified dog.
7. The first five dogs from the heat will be invited to compete in the final. The next five dogs will be held as reserves. If the class is split the top three dogs from each part will be invited to compete in the final. The next top three in each part will be held as reserves.
8. In the event of a dog being unable to compete in the final due to unavailability, illness or injury the reserves from that heat will be called up in numerical order.
9. In the event of a handler being unable to compete in a heat due to illness or injury a substitute handler for the qualifying dog will be allowed to run the dog, providing the substitute handler is still eligible for Grade 3, 4 or 5.

The “**Dog Vegas Qualifier**” is a competition for Small dogs, eligible for Grades 3, 4 & 5.

There are **5 qualifying heats**. The top 3 dogs from each heat (top 2 if the heat is split into 2 parts), will qualify for the “**£ Dog Vegas £**”**Grand Final** comprising of approx 30 (15 small & 15 medium) at the August Dog Vegas show in 2010

1. This class must be judged under the appropriate Kennel Club Rules in force at the time of the competition.
2. If the entry for a heat exceeds the KC limit for a judge in a day then the class will be equally and randomly split and another judge appointed for the second part.
3. All competitors entering the class will be deemed to have agreed to abide by the rules of the Kennel Club and the specific regulations governing this class.
4. The competition is open to Kennel Club registered dogs eligible to compete at Small Height Grade 3, 4 & 5.
5. Handlers may enter more than one dog in the competition and may qualify more than one dog for the final event.
6. Once a dog has qualified for the final it may enter further heats, as long as it is still eligible for Grade 3, 4 or 5. Handlers who have already qualified their dog for the final must report this fact to the appropriate Show Secretary before running in the class. If the already qualified dog then qualifies again, the place will be awarded to the highest placed unqualified dog.
7. The first three dogs from the heat will be invited to compete in the final. The next three dogs will be held as reserves. If the class is split the top two dogs from each part will be invited to compete in the final. The next top two in each part will be held as reserves.
8. In the event of a dog being unable to compete in the final due to unavailability, illness or injury the reserves from that heat will be called up in numerical order.
9. In the event of a handler being unable to compete in a heat due to illness or injury a substitute handler for the qualifying dog will be allowed to run the dog, providing the substitute handler is still eligible for Grade 3, 4 or 5.

Rules and Regulations

1. Dogs entered at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows must be registered at the Kennel Club in accordance with Kennel Club Regulations for Classification and Registration B. The registration number/Authority to Compete number will be required for each entry.
2. Entry Fees: **£2.50** per dog per class, Championship Class **£10.00**, Teams **£10.00**. Camping Fees: **£20.00**. Helping NADTC members **£1.00** per dog per class. Camping available from **2.00 p.m. Friday**, Saturday and Sunday nights, the venue must be vacated by **12.00 noon Monday**.
3. No prize money is on offer.
4. Entries must be made on the official form or a photocopy thereof. Internet entries not available.
5. The Committee of Nottingham ADTC reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.
6. Dogs under 18 calendar months of age on the first day of the Show are not eligible to compete for Kennel club licensed Agility Shows.
7. Not for Competition entries will be accepted for dogs aged four calendar months and over. Dogs must be Kennel Club registered with their details recorded on the entry form.
8. No bitch in season is allowed to compete.
9. No person shall carry out punitive correction or harsh handling of a dog at any time within the boundaries of the Show.
10. Dogs must not wear any type of slip, half-slip collar or lead when under test. A flat, close fitting, leather or webbing collar is permitted, providing the only attachment is a plain identification panel as an integral part of the collar ie. Not attached by a ring.
11. Should a Judge be unable to fulfil the appointment to judge then the Committee reserves the right to appoint another judge.
12. No competitor shall impugn the decision of the judge or judges.
13. Thanks to our sponsors of this show, The Kennel Club, DFS Crufts, Dog Vegas, Showoffs Rosettes & Pawstrading.
14. Kennel Club standard marking will apply as published in the Kennel Club Year Book in use at the time of the show.
15. Hurdle height's for large dogs will be 65cm, for medium dogs will be 45cm and for small dogs will be 35cm. Veteran and Anysize jump heights will be large dogs 35cm and for medium and small dogs 25cm.
16. The Height limit for dogs.
 - a. Large Dogs – For dogs measuring over 43cm (1ft 5ins) at the withers.
 - b. Medium Dogs – For dogs measuring over 35cm (1ft 1.75ins) and measuring 43cm (1ft 5ins) or under at the withers.
 - c. Small Dogs – For dogs measuring 35cm (1ft 1.75ins) or under at the withers.
17. Judges at an Agility Show may not enter for competition a dog which is recorded in their ownership or part ownership; or handle a dog at the show at which they are judging.
18. Withdrawal of dogs from Competition

A dog shall be withdrawn from competition and removed from an Agility Show if it is:

 - a. A bitch which is in season.
 - b. Suffering from any infectious disease or contagious disease.
 - c. Interfering with the safety or chance of winning of an opponent.
 - d. Of such temperament or is so much out of hand as to be a danger to the safety of any person or other animal.
 - e. Likely to cause suffering to the dog if it continues competing.
19. **In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including 25 days before the start of the competition (4th May 2010) shall be counted when entering for any class. For these purposes a competition shall be defined as all classes covered within the same schedule. In the event that a dog becomes eligible for the next grade at a particular show, after the entry for that show has been sent, it is the competitor's responsibility to notify the show secretary at least 14 days before the date of the show (15^h May 2010). The dog will then be moved into the appropriate class(es) for the next grade. The dog must be moved into the corresponding number of classes as were entered at the lower grade. If there are fewer or no classes available for the next grade the competitor will be offered a refund of the relevant entry fees.**
20. Should circumstances so dictate the Society, in consultation with the Judges may alter arrangements as necessary. Such changes and the circumstances surrounding them must be reported to the Kennel Club.
21. In the event that the Show is cancelled due to unforeseen circumstances, Nottingham ADTC will refund fees, less reasonably incurred expenses, on receipt of a stamped, addressed envelope within 1 month of the show date.
22. Food shall not be carried in the hand or given to a dog in the ring.
23. Ballot for Championship Class Running Orders
 - f. Agility Round and Jumping Round – A draw for the running order of the Agility and Jumping Rounds will be made prior to the show. The relevant competitors will be notified before the date of the show. The dogs must run in the order in which they are drawn.
 - g. Final Agility Round – Dogs to run in reverse order to their combined placing at the end of the first two rounds.
24. Separate entry forms must be completed by each Competitor and must be signed by the Competitor or her/his authorised agent in accordance with the provisions specified thereon. Entry forms must be accompanied with the appropriate fees.
25. Passes are not required to gain entrance to the show/showground.
26. Competition of Dogs Suffering from Infectious or Contagious Disease – No dogs suffering from infectious or contagious disease or having been exposed to such disease during the period of 21 days prior to the Competition may compete. Competitors infringing the Regulation will be liable to be fined and/or dealt with under Kennel Club Rule A42.
27. No animal other than one officially entered shall be brought into the precincts of the event during its continuance, except any dogs registered to assist the disabled, or dogs required for educational or instructional purposes or by permission of the General Committee. However, at the discretion of the show society, a dog brought to the show by a spectator may be admitted into the precincts of the dog Show, with the proviso that those in charge of the dog sign a declaration confirming the dog is free from disease and that the dog will be kept under proper control at all times.
28. All dogs resident outside the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete number before entry to the show/event can be made. All overseas entries without an Authority to Compete number will be returned to the exhibitor/competitor.
29. A pay on the day class will be held if time permits.
30. A practice ring may be available to dogs entered for competition at the show, if space allows. This ring must be supervised by a responsible adult with agility knowledge.
31. **Welfare of Dogs.** A Competitor whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not knowingly put their dogs' health and welfare at risk by any action default, omission or otherwise. A breach of this regulation may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rules and Regulations.
32. Additional judges will be appointed if necessary.
33. Competitors must follow the instructions of Stewards with respect to parking, camping and conduct within the show boundaries.
34. All dogs are entered at their owner's risk, whilst every care will be taken, Nottingham ADTC will not accept responsibility for loss, damage or injury to persons, dogs or property however caused.
35. All caravans/camping units must carry suitable fire extinguishers and equipment for fire fighting.
36. Please clear up after your dogs. Anyone knowingly not doing so will be asked to leave the showground forfeiting any remaining entries.
37. **No refunds will be given in the event of incorrect monies being submitted. It is the competitor's responsibility to check the paperwork before submission.** No refunds after the closing date except in exceptional circumstances. Inform the show Secretary as soon as possible.

2. Approaching roundabout (Brownhills) take 1st left onto LINCOLN A46 (N) & Gainsborough (A1133).
3. Follow directions from Mansfield point 4.

From Nottingham (A46)

1. Follow A46 through Farndon and at roundabout go straight on, on to the Newark Bypass, signposted LINCOLN A46.
2. At next roundabout take 3rd exit signposted LINCOLN A46.
3. Follow directions from Mansfield point 3.

From Mansfield (A617)

1. Follow A617, through Kelham, past the Rugby Club to the roundabout at Newark.
