Noise Control at the show..... Important Please make sure you read this carefully.

- 1. A local tannoy will only be used for the full duration of the show. This means that we will only have one speaker mast outside of the secretary's trailer, instead of 5 - 6 masts that we normally have located around the venue.**
- 2. Camping units that are usually sited closest to the house that backs onto the show venue will be moved further away. No day parking will be allowed here either.**

We suggest that you bring walkie talkies to the show. The channel to broadcast ring calling /messages will be published with the running orders. We will also send out a time study on the ring plan which will show approximate times that each class may run for.

ELIGIBILITY FOR CLASSES

In the following definitions of classes First Prizes or other prize wins are those gained in standard classes at any Kennel Club licensed Open Agility Shows (i.e. Limited Agility Shows, special classes and invitation events excepted). Only a first place with a clear round **within course time** will count towards grade progression.

Agility classes to include contact points and Jumping classes where there are no contact obstacles. With this proviso classes are defined as follows:-

Class Structure. A Class may either be held as a Graded Class or a Combined Class. A Graded Class may be scheduled for one or more consecutive Grades with separate results and awards issued for each grade. A Combined Class may be scheduled for more than one consecutive grade with one overall set of results.

Progression. Progression from each Grade will require one Agility win or three Jumping wins at that grade, except that progression from Grade 6 will require 4 wins at Grade 6, two of which must be agility classes. Results from Combined Classes will only count towards progression from the dog's current grade.

Points Progression. At the handler's discretion a dog may progress up to Grade 5 by winning 75 points at each grade, using the Agility Warrant points scheme (Regulation K3.c refers), except that there is no requirement for a minimum number of agility points. If this method of progression is selected, the handler must ensure the Show Secretary signs the dog's Agility Record Book at the first show entered at the higher grade. There is no time limit on this progression, however once a dog has progressed, it cannot return to a previous grade.

STANDARD CLASSES

Only first prizes and points gained in standard classes at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows may be used for progression through the classes. (A dog is only eligible for one grade). In defining the eligibility of the owner or handler for Grade 1, the three jumping wins and points progression referred to in the definition apply only to one dog and not an accumulation of dogs.

Grade 1 (Elementary)

For owners, handlers or dogs which have not gained a first place in an Agility Class or three first places in Jumping Classes at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows. N.B. Owners handlers or dogs previously qualified out of Grade 1, (Elementary) are not eligible for this class

Grade 2 (Starters)

Open to dogs which are not eligible for Grades 1, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7 and have not gained a first place in an Agility Class or three first places in Jumping Classes at Grade 2 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows, or elected to progress on points from Grade 1. N.B. Owners handlers or dogs previously qualified out of Grade 2 (Starters) are not eligible for this class

Grade 3 (Graduate)

Open to dogs which are not eligible for Grade 1 or 2 or have elected to progress on points from Grade 2 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows and dogs which are not eligible for Grade 4, 5, 6 or 7

Grade 4 (Novice)

Open to dogs which have gained a first place in an Agility Class or three first places in Jumping Classes at Grade 3 or elected to progress on points from Grade 3 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows and are not eligible for Grade 3, 5, 6 or 7

Grade 5 (Intermediate)

Open to dogs which have gained a first place in an Agility Class or three first places in Classes at Grade 4 or elected to progress on points from Grade 4 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows and are not eligible for Grade 3, 4, 6 or 7.

Grade 6 (Senior)

Open to dogs which have gained a first place in an Agility Class or three first places in Jumping Classes at Grade 5 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows and are not eligible for Grade 3, 4, 5 or 7

Grade 7 (Advanced)

Open to dogs which have gained a minimum of 4 first places at Grade 6 at Kennel Club Licensed Agility Shows, 2 first places must be gained in Agility (not Jumping) Classes

For each dog entered in a " Vegas " class the sum of £1.00 will go into the Class pot, which will be given out in the Vegas classes.

Example... 120 DOGS entered in Class 60 : Large AGILITY; graded 1 -4 would result in £120 being awarded out between the top 10% of each grade

KC Rules and Regulations

1. Dogs entered at KC licensed Agility shows must be registered at The Kennel Club in accordance with KC regulations for classification and registration B, or else registration or transfer of registration must have been applied for. The registration number/Authority to compete (ATC) number will be required for each entry.
2. Entry - £2.85 per dog per class, "Vegas" classes are £3.85 per dog per class. Camping fees are: £44 per unit for 5 nights. Competitors to vacate the site on Tuesday.
3. Prize money will be awarded in the "Vegas" classes. Each £1 per entry in these classes will be distributed amongst the top 10% in each "Vegas" class.
4. All entries to be made via the Show processor "Longedge Show Processing"
5. The committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.
6. Dog under 18 calendar months of age on the first day of the show are not eligible to compete at KC licensed Agility Shows.
7. Not for competition entries will be accepted for dogs aged 4 calendar months & over. Dogs must be KC registered with their details recorded on the entry form.
8. No bitch in season is allowed to compete.
9. No person shall carry out punitive, corrective or harsh handling of a dog at any time within the boundaries of the Show.
10. Dogs must not wear any type of slip; half-slip collars or leads when under test. A flat, close fitting, leather, or webbing collar is permitted, providing the only attachment is a plain identification panel as an integral part of the collar i.e. not attached by a ring.
11. Should a judge be unable to fulfill the appointment to judge the committee reserves the right to appoint another judge.
12. No competitor shall impugn the decision of the judge or judges
13. Sponsors: Showoffs Rosettes, Rosettes 1st to 6th & 1st place trophy, Kong Rosettes & trophies 1st & 2nd place teams, Active Pet Feeds Rosettes in class 1,44,72,110 & 139.
14. Kennel Club standard-marking regulations shall apply
15. Any size & Veteran jump heights will be 36cm (14") and 22cm (9")
16. The Height limit for dogs. A) Large Dog Classes for dogs measuring over 430mm at the withers. B) Medium Dog Classes for dogs measuring over 350mm and measuring 430mm or under at the withers. C) Small dog classes for dogs measuring 350mm or under at the withers.
17. Judges at an Agility show may not enter for competition a dog, which is recorded in their ownership or part ownership; or handle a dog at the show at which they are judging. Dogs will be disqualified if proved to have been handled by the scheduled judges spouse or immediate family or resident at the same address at the judge.
18. Withdrawal of dogs from competition: A dog shall be withdrawn from competition and removed from the show if it is:-
 - a. A bitch in season.
 - b. Suffering from any infectious diseases or contagious disease.
 - c. Interfering with the safety or chance of winning of an opponent.
 - d. Of such temperament or is so much out of hand as to be a danger to the safety of any person or other animal.
 - e. Likely to cause suffering to the dog if it continues competing.
19. In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including **25** days before the START of the competition i.e. (**13th march 2012**) shall be counted when entering for any class. For these purposes a competition shall be defined as all classes covered within the same schedule. In the event that a dog becomes eligible for the next grade at a particular show, after the entry for that show has been sent, it is the competitor's responsibility to notify the show processor at least 14 days (**23rd March 2012**) before the date of the show. The dog should then be moved into the corresponding number of class(es) as were entered at the lower grade. If there are fewer or no classes available for the next grade the competitor should be offered a refund of the relevant entry fees.
20. Should circumstances so dictate, DVC, in consultation with the Judges, may alter arrangements as necessary. Such changes and the circumstances surrounding them must be reported to the Kennel Club.
21. In the event that the show is cancelled due to unforeseen circumstances, the society (DVC) will refund fees, less reasonably incurred expenses, on receipt of a stamped address envelope submitted within 1 month of the show date.
22. Food shall not be carried in the hand or given to the dog in the ring.
23. Should the judge deem a re-run is required, any result and/or faults gained in the previous run must be discounted
24. Separate entry forms must be completed by each owner and must be signed by the owner or his authorized agent in accordance with provisions specified thereon. Entry forms must be accompanied by the appropriate fees.
25. Free passes are not applicable at this show.
26. Competition of Dogs Suffering from Contagious or Infectious Disease - No dogs suffering from infectious or contagious disease or having been exposed to such disease during the period of 21 days prior to the Competition may compete. Competitors infringing the Regulation will be liable to be fined and/or dealt with under KC rule A42
27. It is the competitor's responsibility to be available for their class and running order. Competitors must run as close to their running order as possible. Failure to do so may be reported to the KC.
28. Animals in Event. No animal other than one officially entered shall be brought into the precincts of the event during its continuance, except any dogs registered to assist the disabled, or dogs required for educational or instructional purposes or by permission of the General Committee. However, at the discretion of the show society, a dog brought to the show by a spectator may be admitted into the precincts of the dog show, with the proviso that those in charge of the dog sign a declaration confirming the dog is free from disease and that the dog will be kept under proper control at all times.
29. All dogs registered and resident outside the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete (ATC) number before entry to the show/event can be made. All overseas entries without a Kennel Club Registration number or an authority to compete number will be returned to the exhibitor/competitor.
30. A pay on the day class may run if time and weather permits
31. A practice ring may be available to dogs entered for competition at the show, if space allows. This ring must be supervised by a responsible adult with agility knowledge.
32. Welfare of Dogs. An exhibitor (or competitor) whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not knowingly put their dogs' health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. A breach of this Regulation may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rules and regulations.
33. Dogs entered are at the owners risk and whilst every care will be taken by DVC Committee, officials & sponsors will accept no responsibility for loss, damage or injury howsoever caused to dogs, persons or property whilst at the show.
34. RTD cheques will incur an extra £10 charge..
35. If a refund is requested by a competitor :- a) Any entries that have been received and processed, then cancelled before the closing date of the show will be refunded with a deduction of the processing costs per entry plus £1.54p to cover the cost of postage and bank charges for cashing and issuing the refund cheque. B) After the closing date, no refunds will be given.
36. No unclaimed rosettes will be posted, unless the competitor sends a SAE.
37. Competitors must follow the instructions of the Stewards with respect to parking, camping and conduct within the show boundaries.
38. Whilst every care will be taken, DVC will not accept responsibility for loss, damage or injury to persons, dogs or property whilst at the show.
39. All caravans/camping units must carry suitable fire extinguishers and facilities for fire fighting.
40. Please clear up after your dogs. Anyone knowingly not doing so will be asked to leave the showground forfeiting any remaining entries.
41. Adults who accompany children are responsible for their children's behavior, actions and safety
42. **Max 3 DOGS PER PERSON TO BE TAKEN ONTO THE EXERCISE AREA AT A TIME**
43. Competitors who allow their dog/dogs to make excessive noise during unsociable hours will be requested by the show manager to keep them quiet. Failure to do so would result in the competitor being required to leave the venue within 1 hour of the decision of the show manager.

DOGS IN CARS ON HOT DAYS

Your dog is vulnerable and at risk during hot weather and the Kennel Club offers the following guidance to help guide you through the do's and don'ts traveling to and whilst at KC licensed events.

- When traveling to a show please take a moment to consider whether the route to the show is on a busy holiday route, and leave earlier to avoid increased time in traffic jams.
- If your vehicle is not air-conditioned seriously consider whether traveling to the show is a good idea at all.
- The vehicle should be as fully ventilated as possible, and plenty of stops should be taken, with lots of water available to drink.
- Ensure your dog is not sitting in full sunlight. There should be plenty of free flowing air around the dog.
- When at the show, never leave your dog in the vehicle.
- Keep the dog in the shade – take your own shade for example a large umbrella and always have plenty of water available to drink so your dog stays well hydrated.
- Avoid your dog taking part in unnecessary exertion or from standing in exposed sunlight for extended lengths of time.

Remember, if you feel hot your dog is very likely to feel much hotter and dehydrated, and this could lead to dire results. Please look after your dog's welfare.

WARNING: IF YOUR DOG IS FOUND TO BE AT RISK FORCIBLE ENTRY TO YOUR VEHICLE MAY BE NECESSARY WITHOUT LIABILITY FOR ANY DAMAGE CAUSED.

Anyone whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not put a dog's health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. Breach of Kennel Club Regulations in this respect may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rules and Regulations.

Right to Refuse Entries. Exhibitors/Competitors are reminded that show societies have the right under Kennel Club Regulation to refuse any entry.

There are **5 qualifying heats**. The top 3 dogs from each heat (top 2 if the heat is split into 2 parts), will qualify for the "£ Dog Vegas £" Grand Final comprising of approx 30 (15 small & 15 medium) at the August Dog Vegas show in 2012

1. This class must be judged under the appropriate Kennel Club Rules in force at the time of the competition
 2. If the entry for a heat exceeds the KC limit for a judge in a day then the class will be equally and randomly split and another judge appointed for the second part.
 3. All competitors entering the class will be deemed to have agreed to abide by the rules of the Kennel Club and the specific regulations governing this class.
 4. The competition is open to Kennel Club registered dogs eligible to compete at Large Height Grade 3,4 & 5.
 5. Handlers may enter more than one dog in the competition and may qualify more than one dog for the final event.
 6. Once a dog has qualified for the final it may enter further heats, as long as it is still eligible for Grade 3,4 or 5.
- Handlers who have already qualified their dog for the final must report this fact to the appropriate Show Secretary before running in the class. If the already qualified dog then qualifies again, the place will be awarded to the highest placed unqualified dog.
7. The first three dogs from the heat will be invited to compete in the final. The next three dogs will be held as reserves.
- If the class is split the top two dogs from each part will be invited to compete in the final. The next top two in each part will be held as reserves.
8. In the event of a dog being unable to compete in the final due to unavailability, illness or injury the reserves from that heat will be called up in numerical order.

Jump heights will be set at Small & Micro.

These classes will not have any weaves.

VETERAN Jumping

For Border Collies 9ys & over. All other breeds 7ys & over.

Dogs may only enter these classes if they are not entered in any other classes at the show. (any size included)

Jump heights will be set at Small & Micro.

The Chase the Ace Team Qualifier

Your dog will love you for it.

Chase the Ace is a competition for teams of four dogs and handlers, run as a relay over a simple "circular", "Helter Skelter" or "Figure of Eight" jumping course. It is designed as a flowing sprint event with spectator appeal; accessible to all grades of handlers and all heights of dogs. Teams of four large, four medium or four small dogs run over the same course at their own height, under identical conditions.

No Tyre can be included in the course .

There are 6 qualifying heats. The top two teams from each heat, regardless of height, qualify for a final comprising of 12 teams at the Dog Vegas Dogs Summer Holiday show.

- The competition is classified under Kennel Club Regulations as Combined Grades 1 to 7 and Special, and will be held under KC Rules and Show Regulations H & H1 as in force at the date of the competition. Additional rules apply as described below. Competitors entering this competition are deemed to have agreed to abide by these rules.
- All dogs entered in the team (including reserves) MUST be entered in the show in at least 1 normal height class (i.e. not veterans or anysize).
- All teams must consist of four dogs of the same height classification, handled by four separate handlers. All teams will compete over the same course at the appropriate height of the team of dogs competing.
- Substitute dogs for teams are permitted, provided that (i) the dog(s) is/are already entered in the show, (ii) the dog(s) is/are not already entered in another team in this heat and (iii) alterations are made before the run and recorded on the scribe sheet.
- Dogs may only compete in one team in any given heat. Should one dog be entered in more than one qualifying team across the heats then the first team to have qualified will go through to the final and any subsequent teams will not be eligible (this DOES NOT apply to handlers).
- The course must contain two changeover lines, clearly marked with start/finish poles, each with a minimum gate width of 4m. Dogs 1 & 3 start behind line A and finish behind line B. Dogs 2 & 4 start behind line B and finish behind line A. (Handler 1 may use a recall start). The inward and outward courses can be different, but both dogs from behind the same line must run the same course.
- The course each dog is required to negotiate shall contain no less than 14 and no more than 20 obstacles.
- This is a relay event and two suitable batons must be provided. All baton changes must be completed with the handlers and dogs behind the appropriate changeover line. Failure to comply with this, or an incorrect baton change (i.e. throwing or dropping the baton at changeover) will incur a penalty of 50 points on each occasion. Stewards may be appointed by the judge to adjudicate changeovers if required.
- For each dog an elimination on the course incurs a single penalty of 100 points, however the judge will continue to mark any further faults on the remainder of the course and the faults of any remaining dogs.
- The team with the fastest time and the least faults, wins. The top two teams from each heat qualify for the final (unless the heat is split – see rule 11).
- If the entry for a heat exceeds the KC limit for a judge in a day then the class will be equally and randomly split. The winning team from each part will be regarded as the two qualifying teams from that heat.
- Only the members of an original qualifying team (as specified on the scribe sheet at the time of the run) or the two original named reserves, will be allowed to compete in the final.
- In the event of a team being unavailable for the final, a reserve team will be called from the heat in which the qualifying team qualified.

Individual trophies and rosettes will be provided for 1st and 2nd placed teams (in the event of a split heat trophies will go to 1st placed teams for each part).

DIRECTIONS TO THE VENUE

Directions from the Humber Bridge

After crossing the river take the first slip road sign-posted Barton and Winterton (A1077) and take the 3rd exit at the slip road roundabout.

Follow this road through the village of South Ferriby, past the cement works and along the side of the river. As the road leaves the side of the river you will approach some very sharp bends in the road. On one of these bends take a left turn sign-posted Appleby and Broughton.

Take the 2nd turning on your right sign-posted Winterton. The venue is ¼ mile on your right hand side. If you reach the mini roundabout you have gone too far.

From the A15 (Lincoln, Newark etc)

At the junction with the M180 take the 2nd exit at the roundabout signposted A18 Scunthorpe, Brigg and Broughton. Now proceed to *

From the East (Grimsby etc)

Leave the M180 at junction 4 and take the 3rd exit at the roundabout signposted A18 Scunthorpe, Brigg and Broughton. Now proceed to *

From the West (M1, M18, M62 etc)

Leave the M180 at junction 4 and take the 1st exit at the roundabout signposted A18 Scunthorpe, Brigg and Broughton. Now proceed to *

* At the next roundabout take the 2nd exit sign-posted **Broughton**. At the mini roundabout in Broughton Village bear left sign-posted **scenic drive**. In approx. 2.5 miles you will reach a railway crossing. Care is needed here, as the crossing is very uneven.

Having driven through the village of Appleby continue for approximately 2 miles, taking the 3rd turning on your left sign-posted **Winterton** (do not take the first turning on your left which is also sign-posted Winterton as this involves a difficult junction for caravans!). The venue is ¼ mile on your right hand side. If you reach the mini roundabout you have gone too far.

FRIDAY CLASSES
