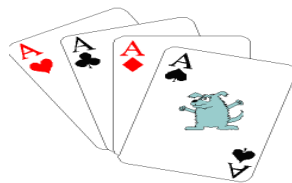

### **Class 1 First Contact Qualifier Agility Combined 1 & 2**

1. This class must be judged under the appropriate Kennel Club Rules in force at the time of the competition.
2. All competitors entering the class will be deemed to have agreed to abide by the rules of the Kennel Club and the specific regulations governing this class.
3. The competition is open to Kennel Club registered dogs eligible to compete at Large Height Grade 1 & 2.
4. Handlers may enter more than one dog in the competition and may qualify more than one dog for the final event.
5. Once a dog has qualified for the final it may enter further heats, as long as it is still eligible for Starter classes.
6. Handlers who have already qualified their dog for the final must report this fact to the appropriate Show Secretary before running in the class. If the already qualified dog then qualifies again, the place will be awarded to the highest placed unqualified dog.
7. The first five dogs from the heat will be invited to compete in the final. The next five dogs will be held as reserves.
8. If the class is split the top three dogs from each part will be invited to compete in the final. The next top three in each part will be held as reserves.
9. In the event of a dog being unable to compete in the final due to unavailability, illness or injury the reserves from that heat will be called up in numerical order.
10. In the event of a handler being unable to compete in a heat due to illness or injury a substitute handler for the qualifying dog will be allowed to run the dog, providing the substitute handler is still eligible for Grade 1 or 2.

The "Dog Vegas Qualifier" is a competition for Large dogs, eligible for Grades 3, 4 & 5.

There are **ten qualifying heats**. The top 5 dogs from each heat (top 3 if the heat is split into 2 parts), will qualify for the "**£ Dog Vegas £**" **Grand Final** comprising of approx 50 at the August Dog Vegas show in 2010

1. This class must be judged under the appropriate Kennel Club Rules in force at the time of the competition
2. If the entry for a heat exceeds the KC limit for a judge in a day then the class will be equally and randomly split and another judge appointed for the second part.
3. All competitors entering the class will be deemed to have agreed to abide by the rules of the Kennel Club and the specific regulations governing this class.
4. The competition is open to Kennel Club registered dogs eligible to compete at Large Height Grade 3, 4 & 5.
5. Handlers may enter more than one dog in the competition and may qualify more than one dog for the final event.
6. Once a dog has qualified for the final it may enter further heats, as long as it is still eligible for Grade 3, 4 or 5.
7. Handlers who have already qualified their dog for the final must report this fact to the appropriate Show Secretary before running in the class. If the already qualified dog then qualifies again, the place will be awarded to the highest placed unqualified dog.
8. The first five dogs from the heat will be invited to compete in the final. The next five dogs will be held as reserves.
9. If the class is split the top three dogs from each part will be invited to compete in the final. The next top three in each part will be held as reserves.
10. In the event of a dog being unable to compete in the final due to unavailability, illness or injury the reserves from that heat will be called up in numerical order.
11. In the event of a handler being unable to compete in a heat due to illness or injury a substitute handler for the qualifying dog will be allowed to run the dog, providing the substitute handler is still eligible for Grade 3, 4 or 5.

## Class 27 The 'Laser' Knockout Pairs Rules

The 'Laser' knockout pairs is a fun competition, sponsored by Blair and Jenny Willis in memory of Laser (Fels Magic Laser), who really loved competing in the knockout pairs competitions.

- 1) **The class will be open only to all large dogs.**
- 2) **There will be eight qualifying heats. The top four pairs from each heat will qualify for the Final, which will take place at Dashin' Dogs summer show in 2010. Once a pair has qualified for the final, they may not run in further heats for the final which they have qualified for.**
- 3) **Handlers may enter more than one pair. Dogs may only compete in one pair in any heat. If a handler has entered more than one pair and is drawn to run against themselves, they may nominate another handler to run one of the dogs, that handler must then continue to run the dog for the rest of the heat and if they qualify for the final, they must run the dog in the final. Alternatively the handler can nominate which pair should continue in the heat.**
- 4) **The pairs will compete against each other over two similar courses. There will be a judge for each course. There will be a baton change between the first and second handler which must take place behind a line, failure to do so will incur 100 faults. Time and faults will be added together and the winning pair will be the one with the lowest time. The judges' decision will be final.**
- 5) **The course will consist of 10 obstacles made up of jumps, tunnels and weaves (6 poles) only. Normal marking will apply. If a dog is eliminated, it will incur 100 faults. Should both pairs be eliminated, the pair which was eliminated first will lose.**
- 6) **The winning pairs from each round will go through to the next round until there is only one pair remaining.**
- 7) **Pairs will be issued with a running order which must be strictly adhered to. Pairs failing to run when due will be knocked out and the other pair will go through to the next round.**
- 8) **Only handlers and dogs originally entered may compete at the final (except in the case of rule 3). Any changes are at the organisers' discretion.**

The winners and runners up for each heat will receive a trophy and rosettes will be presented to the last 8 pairs.



## Class 8 The Team Dash Rules 2010

The 'Team Dash' is a competition for teams of four dogs and handlers, run as a relay over a simple jumping course. It is designed as a sprint event with spectator appeal; accessible to all grades of handlers and all heights of dogs. Teams of four large, four medium or four small dogs run over the same course at their own height, under identical conditions.

There are ten qualifying heats. The top two teams from each heat, regardless of height, qualify for a final comprising of twenty teams at Dashin' Dogs summer show: August 2010.

Any shortfall of teams (heats lost due to show cancellation etc) will be made up with qualifying teams from Dashin' Dogs summer show.

**It is a requirement of this competition that the course contains no traps, and is of 'fast and flowing style'. A simple course such as a figure of eight, or a largely circular or helter-skelter style course is most appropriate.**

- The competition is classified under Kennel Club Regulations as Combined Grades 1 to 7 and Special, and will be held under KC Rules and Show Regulations H & H1 as in force at the date of the competition. Additional rules apply as described below. Competitors entering this Competition are deemed to have agreed to abide by these rules.
- If the entry for a heat exceeds the KC limit for a judge in a day then the class will be equally and randomly split and another judge appointed for the second part. The winning team from each part will be regarded as the two qualifying teams from that heat.
- All teams must consist of four dogs of the same height classification, handled by four separate handlers. Conditions remain the same for all teams except that the height of equipment will be appropriate to the height of the team of dogs competing.
- Additions or substitutions to teams (handlers or dogs) are permitted, provided that (i) the substitute(s) is/are already entered in the heat (as a team member or reserve) (ii) rule (5) is not breached and (iii) alterations to teams are made before the run.
- Handlers may compete in more than one team in a heat, providing they handle a different dog in each team. In the event of a handler being in both qualifying teams then their highest placed team will be deemed to have qualified. Dogs may only compete in one team in any given heat.
- The course must contain two changeover lines, clearly marked on the ground, each with a minimum gate width of 4m. Dogs 1 & 3 start behind line A and finish behind line B. Dogs 2 & 4 start behind line B and finish behind line A. (Handler 1 may use a recall start). The inward and outward courses can be different, but both dogs from behind the same line must run the same course.
- The course each dog is required to negotiate shall contain no less than 14 and no more than 20 obstacles.
- This is a relay event and two suitable batons must be provided. All baton changes must be completed with the handlers and dogs behind the appropriate changeover line. Failure to comply with this, or an incorrect baton change (i.e. throwing or dropping the baton at changeover) will incur a penalty of 50 points on each occasion. Stewards may be appointed by the judge to adjudicate changeovers if required.
- For each dog an elimination on the course incurs a single penalty of 100 points, however the judge will continue to mark any further faults on the remainder of the course and the faults of any remaining dogs.
- The team with the fastest time and the least faults, wins. The top two teams from each heat qualify for the final. Once qualified, neither handlers nor dogs may compete in the remaining heats for that season except as Not For Competition. (N.F.C.)
- Only the members of an original qualifying team (as specified on the scribe sheet at the time of the run) or the two original named reserves, will be allowed to compete in the final. Changes are at the organiser's discretion and only under exceptional circumstances.
- In the event of a team being unavailable for the final, a reserve team will be called from the heat in which the qualifying team qualified.
- **To 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> placed teams: Individual trophies and rosettes (4x: 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup>)**
- **To 6<sup>th</sup> placed teams: Individual rosettes (4x: 3<sup>rd</sup>, 4<sup>th</sup>, 5<sup>th</sup>, 6<sup>th</sup>)**

1. This class must be judged under the appropriate Kennel Club Rules in force at the time of the competition
2. If the entry for a heat exceeds the KC limit for a judge in a day then the class will be equally and randomly split and another judge appointed for the second part.
3. All competitors entering the class will be deemed to have agreed to abide by the rules of the Kennel Club and the specific regulations governing this class.
4. The competition is open to Kennel Club registered dogs eligible to compete at Large Height Grade 3, 4 & 5.
5. Handlers may enter more than one dog in the competition and may qualify more than one dog for the final event.
6. Once a dog has qualified for the final it may enter further heats, as long as it is still eligible for Grade 3, 4 or 5.
7. Handlers who have already qualified their dog for the final must report this fact to the appropriate Show Secretary before running in the class. If the already qualified dog then qualifies again, the place will be awarded to the highest placed unqualified dog.

1. This class must be judged under the appropriate Kennel Club Rules in force at the time of the competition
2. If the entry for a heat exceeds the KC limit for a judge in a day then the class will be equally and randomly split and another judge appointed for the second part.
3. All competitors entering the class will be deemed to have agreed to abide by the rules of the Kennel Club and the specific regulations governing this class.
4. The competition is open to Kennel Club registered dogs eligible to compete at Large Height Grade 3, 4 & 5.
5. Handlers may enter more than one dog in the competition and may qualify more than one dog for the final event.
6. Once a dog has qualified for the final it may enter further heats, as long as it is still eligible for Grade 3, 4 or 5.

### **Eligibility and Definition of Classes**

This classification should apply to competitions for large, medium & small dogs. In the following definitions of classes First Prizes or other prize wins are those gained in standard classes at any Kennel Club licensed Open agility shows (i.e. limited agility shows, special classes & invitation events excepted). Only a first place with a clear round will count towards grade progression. Societies may schedule classes other than those defined below. The eligibility for "special" classes must be defined by the society & included in the schedule. The word "special" must be included in the title of the class. Agility classes to include contact points & jumping classes where there are not contact obstacles. With this proviso classes are defined as follows:

**Class Structure:** a class may either be held as a **Graded class** or a **Combined class**. A Graded class may be scheduled for one or more consecutive grades with separate results & awards issued for each grade. A Combined class may be scheduled for more than one consecutive grade with one overall set of results.

**Progression:** Progression from each grade will require one agility win or three jumping wins at that grade, except the progression from Grade 6 will require 4 wins at Grade 6, two of which must be agility classes. Results from combined classes will only count towards progression from the dog's current grade.

**Points Progression:** at the handler's discretion a dog may progress up to grade 5 by winning 75 points at each grade, using the Agility Warrant points scheme, regulation K3.c refers, except that there is no requirement for a minimum number of agility points. If this method of progression is selected, the handler must ensure the show secretary signs the dog's Agility Record Book at the first show entered at the higher grade. There is no time limit on this progression, however, once a dog has progressed, it cannot return to a previous grade.

Only first prizes & points gained in standard classes at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows may be used for progression through the classes. (A dog is only eligible for one grade).

<b>Grade 1 (Elementary)</b>	For owners, handlers or dogs which have not gained a first place in an agility class or three first places in jumping classes at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows. N.B. Owners, handlers or dogs previously qualified out of grade 1 (Elementary) are not eligible for this class.
<b>Grade 2 (Starters)</b>	For owners, handlers or dogs which have qualified out of Grade 1 but have not gained a first place in an Agility Class or three Jumping Classes at Grade 2 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows. N.B. Owners, handlers or dogs previously qualified out of Grade 2 (Starters) are not eligible for this class.
<b>Grade 3 (Graduate)</b>	Open to dogs which are not eligible for Grade 1 or 2 or have elected to progress on points from Grade 2 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows & dogs which are not eligible for Grades 4, 5, 6 or 7.
<b>Grade 4 (Novice)</b>	Open to dogs which have gained a first place in an Agility Class or three Jumping Classes at Grade 3 or elected to progress on points from Grade 3 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows and are not eligible for Grades 3, 5, 6 or 7.
<b>Grade 5 (Intermediate)</b>	Open to dogs which have gained a first place in an Agility Class or three Jumping Classes at Grade 4 or elected to progress on points from Grade 4 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows and are not eligible for Grades 3, 4, 6 or 7.
<b>Grade 6 (Senior)</b>	Open to dogs which have gained a first place in an Agility Class or three Jumping Classes at Grade 5 or elected to progress on points from Grade 5 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows and are not eligible for Grades 3, 4, 6 or 7.
<b>Grade 7 (Advanced)</b>	Open to dogs which have gained a minimum of four first places at Grade 6 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows, two first places must be gained in Agility (not Jumping) Classes.

### **DOGS IN CARS ON HOT DAYS**

Your dog is vulnerable and at risk during hot weather and the Kennel Club offers the following guidance to help guide you through the do's and don'ts travelling to and whilst at KC licensed events.

- When travelling to a show please take a moment to consider whether the route to the show is on a busy holiday route, and leave earlier to avoid increased time in traffic jams.
- If your vehicle is not air-conditioned seriously consider whether travelling to the show is a good idea at all.
- The vehicle should be as fully ventilated as possible, and plenty of stops should be taken, with lots of water available to drink.
- Ensure your dog is not sitting in full sunlight. There should be plenty of free flowing air around the dog.
- When at the show, never leave your dog in the vehicle.
- Keep the dog in the shade – take your own shade for example a large umbrella and always have plenty of water available to drink so your dog stays well hydrated.
- Avoid your dog taking part in unnecessary exertion, or from standing in exposed sunlight for extended lengths of time.

Remember, if you feel hot your dog is very likely to feel much hotter and dehydrated, and this could lead to dire results. Please look after your dog's welfare.

**WARNING: IF YOUR DOG IS FOUND TO BE AT RISK FORCIBLE ENTRY TO YOUR VEHICLE MAY BE NECESSARY WITHOUT LIABILITY FOR ANY DAMAGE CAUSED.**

Anyone whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not put a dog's health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. Breach of Kennel Club Regulations in this respect may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rules and Regulations.

Right to Refuse Entries. Exhibitors/Competitors are reminded that show societies have the right under Kennel Club Regulation to refuse any entry.

### KC Rules and Regulations

1. Dogs entered at KC licensed Agility Tests must be registered at The Kennel Club in accordance with KC regulations for classification for registration B or possess an authority to compete from the Kennel Club .The registration number/Authority to compete number will be required for each entry.
2. The committee reserves a right to refuse entries and bar persons from venue.
3. Puppies under the age of 18 months of age on the first day of the competition are not eligible for KC Agility Tests.
4. No bitch in season is allowed to compete.
5. The mating of bitches within the precincts of the Show is forbidden.
6. No person shall carry out punitive, corrective or harsh handling of a dog at any time within the boundaries of the Show.
7. Dogs must not wear any type of slip; half-slip collars or leads when under test. A flat, close fitting, leather, or webbing collar is permitted, providing the only attachment is a plain identification panel as an integral part of the collar i.e. not attached by a ring.
8. Should a judge be unable to fulfill the appointment to judge the committee reserves the right to appoint another judge.
9. No competitor shall impugn the decision of the judge or judges.
10. Kennel Club standard-marking regulations shall apply.
11. Obstacles shall be in accordance with Annex B to H Regulations.
12. Competition for Large Dogs – For those measuring over 43cm at the withers, Competition for Medium Dogs- For those measuring over 35cm & measuring 43cm or under at the withers, Competition for Small dogs- For those measuring 35cm or under at the withers.
13. Judges at an Agility Test may not enter for competition a dog, which is recorded in their ownership or part ownership; or handle a dog at the Test at which they are judging.
14. A dog shall be withdrawn from competition and removed from the test if it is;
  - a. A bitch in season.
  - b. Suffering from any infectious or contagious disease.
  - c. Interfering with the safety or chance of winning of an opponent.
  - d. Of such temperament or is so much out of hand as to be a danger to the safety of any person or other animal.
  - e. Likely to cause suffering to the dog if it continues competing.
15. In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including **25 days (20<sup>th</sup> April 2010)** before the START of the competition shall be counted when entering any class. For these purposes a competition shall be defined as all classes covered within the same schedule. In the event that a dog becomes eligible for the next grade at a particular show, after the entry for that show has been sent, it is the competitor's responsibility to notify the show secretary at least 14 days (**1<sup>st</sup> May 2010**) (before the date of the show. The dog should then be moved into the appropriate class(es) for the next grade. The dog must be moved into the corresponding classes as were entered at the lower grade. If there are fewer or no classes available for the next grade the competitor should be offered a refund of the relevant entry fees.
16. It is the competitor's responsibility to be available for their class and running order.
17. Handlers working more than one dog in a class must ensure that the dogs compete in the sequence in which they are drawn. Failure to do so may result in elimination.
18. Should circumstances so dictate, DVC, in consultation with the Judges, may alter arrangements as necessary. Such changes and the circumstances surrounding them must be reported to the Kennel Club.
19. A dog must at the time of entry for the Competition be registered as required by the Kennel Club Rules & Regulations in the competitor's name (or registration or transfer applied for). In the case of a partnership the full name of every partner must be given. In the case of dogs recorded as owned by a limited company, the directors and the secretary of the limited company will jointly be considered for the purpose of the Regulations. A dog acquired subsequent to entry having been made at a Competition may compete as the new owner's property provided that an application for the transfer has been forwarded to the Kennel Club before the Competition, and the new owner has undertaken to abide by the Regulations and conditions of the original entry form.
20. In the event of cancellation and or abandonment DVC reserves the right to defray from entries received such as they deem are necessary.
21. Dogs entered are at the owners risk and whilst every care will be taken the committee, officials & sponsors will accept no responsibility for loss, damage or injury howsoever caused to dogs, persons or property whilst at the show.
22. Any dog which is of such a temperament or is so much out of hand or a danger (potential or real) to other dogs or people at the venue will be required to leave within 1 hour of the decision of the show manager.
23. No animal may be sold within the boundaries of the showground.
24. Entry - £2.60 per dog per class, "Vegas" classes are £3.60 per dog per class. Camping fees are: £18 per unit for 2 nights (Friday, Saturday) or £20 per unit for 3 nights (Fri to Sun ) Competitors to vacate the site on Monday by 10am.
25. RTD cheques will incur an extra £10 charge..
26. NFC dogs over 4 months must be KC registered with details shown on entry form.
27. Dogs will not be accepted in a class after the class has been declared closed
28. Reserve Judges: Additional reserve judges will be appointed if necessary
29. A pay on the day class may run if time and weather permits.
30. No unclaimed rosettes will be posted, unless the competitor sends a SAE.
31. Competitors must follow the instructions of the Stewards with respect to parking, camping and conduct within the show boundaries.
32. Whilst every care will be taken, DVC will not accept responsibility for loss, damage or injury to persons, dogs or property whilst at the show.
33. All caravans/camping units must carry suitable fire extinguishers and facilities for fire fighting.
34. Please clear up after your dogs. Anyone knowingly not doing so will be asked to leave the showground forfeiting any remaining entries.
35. Adults who accompany children are responsible for their children's behavior, actions and safety
36. **ONLY TWO DOGS PER PERSON TO BE TAKEN ONTO THE EXERCISE AREA AT A TIME**
37. Competitors who allow their dog/dogs to make excessive noise during unsociable hours will be requested by the show manager to keep them quiet. Failure to do so would result in the competitor being required to leave the venue within 1 hour of the decision of the show manager.
38. No animal other than one officially entered shall be brought into the precincts of the event during its continuance, except a registered guide dog for the blind or a hearing dog for the deaf, or dogs required for educational or instructional purposes or by permission of the General Committee. However, at the discretion of the show society, a dog brought to the show by a spectator may be admitted into the precincts of the dog show, with the proviso that those in charge of the dog sign a declaration confirming the dog is free from disease and that the dog will be kept under proper control at all times.

## DIRECTIONS TO THE VENUE

### Directions from the Humber Bridge

After crossing the river take the first slip road sign-posted Barton and Winterton (A1077) and take the 3rd exit at the slip road roundabout.

Follow this road through the village of South Ferriby, past the cement works and along the side of the river. As the road leaves the side of the river you will approach some very sharp bends in the road. On one of these bends take a left turn sign-posted Appleby and Broughton.

Take the 2nd turning on your right sign-posted Winterton. The venue is ¼ mile on your right hand side. If you reach the mini roundabout you have gone too far.

### **From the A15 (Lincoln, Newark etc)**

At the junction with the M180 take the 2nd exit at the roundabout signposted A18 Scunthorpe, Brigg and Broughton. Now proceed to \*

### **From the East (Grimsby etc)**

Leave the M180 at junction 4 and take the 3rd exit at the roundabout signposted A18 Scunthorpe, Brigg and Broughton. Now proceed to \*

### **From the West (M1, M18, M62 etc)**

Leave the M180 at junction 4 and take the 1st exit at the roundabout signposted A18 Scunthorpe, Brigg and Broughton. Now proceed to \*

\* At the next roundabout take the 2nd exit sign-posted **Broughton**. At the mini roundabout in Broughton Village bear left sign-posted **scenic drive**. In approx. 2.5 miles you will reach a railway crossing. Care is needed here, as the crossing is very uneven.

Having driven through the village of Appleby continue for approximately 2 miles, taking the 3rd turning on your left sign-posted **Winterton** (do not take the first turning on your left which is also sign-posted Winterton as this involves a difficult junction for caravans!). The venue is ¼ mile on your right hand side. If you reach the mini roundabout you have gone too far.
