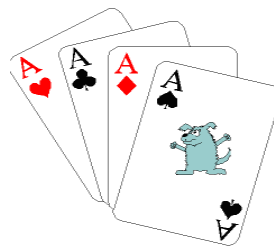

Including the "JUDGES ARE SPECIAL" INVITATION CLASS

To be held on the Saturday eve, after all the other rings have closed.

This class is open to anyone that has kindly judged at any of the Dog Vegas shows from November 2009 to September 2010. This includes the Independent shows as well as the KC shows.

The class is open to all heights & all grades of dogs (including veteran /any size dogs).

Judges may enter one of their dogs in the class

All dogs will compete the same course & one set of results will be awarded.

The class will be jumping

There will be 'goodies' on offer as prizes from Paws Trading, CSJ and the Dog Vegas team.

There will also be a perpetual trophy to the winner - which you can present to next years'

'Judges are special' winner in September 2011.

KC Rules and Regulations

1. Dogs entered at KC licensed Agility Tests must be registered at The Kennel Club in accordance with KC regulations for classification for registration B or possess an authority to compete from the Kennel Club .The registration number/Authority to compete number will be required for each entry.
2. The committee reserves a right to refuse entries and bar persons from venue.
3. Puppies under the age of 18 months of age on the first day of the competition are not eligible for KC Agility Tests.
4. No bitch in season is allowed to compete.
5. The mating of bitches within the precincts of the Show is forbidden.
6. No person shall carry out punitive, corrective or harsh handling of a dog at any time within the boundaries of the Show.
7. Dogs must not wear any type of slip; half-slip collars or leads when under test. A flat, close fitting, leather, or webbing collar is permitted, providing the only attachment is a plain identification panel as an integral part of the collar i.e. not attached by a ring.
8. Should a judge be unable to fulfill the appointment to judge the committee reserves the right to appoint another judge.
9. No competitor shall impugn the decision of the judge or judges.
10. Kennel Club standard-marking regulations shall apply.
11. Obstacles shall be in accordance with Annex B to H Regulations.
12. Competition for Large Dogs - For those measuring over 43cm at the withers, Competition for Medium Dogs- For those measuring over 35cm & measuring 43cm or under at the withers, Competition for Small dogs- For those measuring 35cm or under at the withers.
13. Judges at an Agility Test may not enter for competition a dog, which is recorded in their ownership or part ownership; or handle a dog at the Test at which they are judging.
14. A dog shall be withdrawn from competition and removed from the test if it is;
 - a. A bitch in season.
 - b. Suffering from any infectious or contagious disease.
 - c. Interfering with the safety or chance of winning of an opponent.
 - d. Of such temperament or is so much out of hand as to be a danger to the safety of any person or other animal.
 - e. Likely to cause suffering to the dog if it continues competing.
15. In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including **25 days (31st August 2010)** before the START of the competition shall be counted when entering any class. For these purposes a competition shall be defined as all classes covered within the same schedule. In the event that a dog becomes eligible for the next grade at a particular show, after the entry for that show has been sent, it is the competitor's responsibility to notify the show secretary at least 14 days (**11th September 2010**) (before the date of the show. The dog should then be moved into the appropriate class (es) for the next grade. The dog must be moved into the corresponding classes as were entered at the lower grade. If there are fewer or no classes available for the next grade the competitor should be offered a refund of the relevant entry fees.
16. It is the competitor's responsibility to be available for their class and running order.
17. Handlers working more than one dog in a class must ensure that the dogs compete in the sequence in which they are drawn. Failure to do so may result in elimination.
18. Should circumstances so dictate, DVC, in consultation with the Judges, may alter arrangements as necessary. Such changes and the circumstances surrounding them must be reported to the Kennel Club.
19. A dog must at the time of entry for the Competition be registered as required by the Kennel Club Rules & Regulations in the competitor's name (or registration or transfer applied for). In the case of a partnership the full name of every partner must be given. In the case of dogs recorded as owned by a limited company, the directors and the secretary of the limited company will jointly be considered for the purpose of the Regulations. A dog acquired subsequent to entry having been made at a Competition may compete as the new owner's property provided that an application for the transfer has been forwarded to the Kennel Club before the Competition, and the new owner has undertaken to abide by the Regulations and conditions of the original entry form.
20. In the event of cancellation and or abandonment DVC reserves the right to defray from entries received such as they deem are necessary.
21. Dogs entered are at the owners risk and whilst every care will be taken the committee, officials & sponsors will accept no responsibility for loss, damage or injury howsoever caused to dogs, persons or property whilst at the show.
22. Any dog which is of such a temperament or is so much out of hand or a danger (potential or real) to other dogs or people at the venue will be required to leave within 1 hour of the decision of the show manager.
23. No animal may be sold within the boundaries of the showground.
24. Entry - £2.65 per dog per class, "Vegas" classes are £3.65 per dog per class. Camping fees are: £20 per unit for 2 nights (Friday & Saturday) or £25 for 3 nights Friday to Sunday
25. RTD cheques will incur an extra £10 charge.
26. If a refund is requested by a competitor :- a) Any entries that have been received and processed, then cancelled before the closing date of the show will be refunded with a deduction of the processing costs per entry plus £1.54p to cover the cost of postage and bank charges for cashing and issuing the refund cheque. B) After the closing date, no refunds will be given.
27. NFC dogs over 4 months must be KC registered with details shown on entry form.
28. Dogs will not be accepted in a class after the class has been declared closed
29. Reserve Judges: Additional reserve judges will be appointed if necessary
30. A pay on the day class may run if time and weather permits.
31. No unclaimed rosettes will be posted, unless the competitor sends a SAE.

32. Competitors must follow the instructions of the Stewards with respect to parking, camping and conduct within the show boundaries.
33. Whilst every care will be taken, DVC will not accept responsibility for loss, damage or injury to persons, dogs or property whilst at the show.
34. All caravans/camping units must carry suitable fire extinguishers and facilities for fire fighting.
35. Please clear up after your dogs. Anyone knowingly not doing so will be asked to leave the showground forfeiting any remaining entries.
36. Adults who accompany children are responsible for their children's behavior, actions and safety
37. **ONLY TWO DOGS PER PERSON TO BE TAKEN ONTO THE EXERCISE AREA AT A TIME**
38. Competitors who allow their dog/dogs to make excessive noise during unsociable hours will be requested by the show manager to keep them quiet. Failure to do so would result in the competitor being required to leave the venue within 1 hour of the decision of the show manager.
39. No animal other than one officially entered shall be brought into the precincts of the event during its continuance, except a registered guide dog for the blind or a hearing dog for the deaf, or dogs required for educational or instructional purposes or by permission of the General Committee. However, at the discretion of the show society, a dog brought to the show by a spectator may be admitted into the precincts of the dog show, with the proviso that those in charge of the dog sign a declaration confirming the dog is free from disease and that the dog will be kept under proper control at all times.

THE RAS/CSJ MEDIUM ABC AGILITY STAKES

CLASS 41 The RAS/CSJ Medium ABC Agility Stakes is sponsored by

RAS – suppliers of Superb Quality Rosettes and Ribbons for all occasions, selling all the supplies you need to run a successful show.

CSJ – a **unique range of natural canine feeds, herbal supplements and treats** to meet the requirements of all working dogs and has now become the **first choice** for many of the **top dog handlers** in agility and many other canine sports.

1. The RAS/CSJ Medium ABC Agility Stakes is a special agility competition to be run under Kennel Club Rules and Regulations H for Medium dogs.
2. The competition is open to all grades of Medium dogs (1-7) excluding Border Collies, Working Sheepdogs and their crosses (Any Breeds but Collies).

Clarification: for this competition, a BC or WSD cross is any dog that is 50% or more BC or WSD. In the event of dispute, the matter can be referred, with evidence, to the organiser who will investigate. Any wins/placings will stand unless the disputed dog is deemed by the organiser to be ineligible for the class, in which case the next eligible dog(s) will be promoted (See Note to Judges below).

3. The first two dogs of each heat will qualify for the Final. The next best placed dogs at a heat will be deemed to be reserves should a qualified dog be unable to attend the Final. Reserves from heats may be invited to attend the Final up to and including the closing date of the Finals Show. After the closing date NO reserves will be called even if other qualifiers have to retire/withdraw.
4. Those dogs eligible to compete in the Final shall be the best-placed dogs in each heat which have not previously qualified.
5. Dogs that have already qualified for the Final may enter further heats for competition, and receive prizes for any placings. There will be a trophy for the first placed dog and for the highest placed qualified dog. (Which may be the same dog, except where the winner of the heat has already qualified.)

It is the responsibility of the owner/handler of a previously qualified dog to inform the Show Secretary and heat scribe before competing in further heats.

6. A handler may qualify more than one dog for the Final.
7. The Final will be held at the Hare 'n Hounds Show in September. Any alteration will be publicised.
8. Owners, handlers and dogs who enter the heats or attend the Final will be deemed to have accepted the Rules and Regulations of the competition and the organising show.
9. The organiser reserves the right to alter these Rules and Regulations at their discretion.

Note to judges:

- This is an agility competition that must contain at least two items of contact equipment (which may be traversed more than once each) and at least one set of between 5 and 12 weaves.
- In the event of a query over a dog's eligibility to run in the class, allow it to proceed, but inform the Show Management with any evidence of its ineligibility, who will pass on the evidence to the Medium ABC Agility Stakes organiser, who will investigate. In the event of an ineligible dog having been found to be placed or qualified, these placings/qualification will be removed and the next placed dog(s) promoted, and the dog and handler barred from further entry in the Stakes at any further shows.

Class 22,23 & 48ANY SIZE

Dogs may only enter these classes if they are not entered in any other classes at the show. (veteran classes included)
Jump heights will be set at Small & Micro.
These classes will not have any weaves.

Class 24,25 & 49 VETERAN

For Border Collies 9yrs & over. All other breeds 7yrs & over.

Dogs may only enter these classes if they are not entered in any other classes at the show. (any size included)
Jump heights will be set at Small & Micro.
These classes will not have any weaves

Eligibility and Definition of Classes

This classification should apply to competitions for large, medium & small dogs. In the following definitions of classes First Prizes or other prize wins are those gained in standard classes at any Kennel Club licensed Open agility shows (i.e. limited agility shows, special classes & invitation events excepted). Only a first place with a clear round will count towards grade progression. Societies may schedule classes other than those defined below. The eligibility for "special" classes must be defined by the society & included in the schedule. The word "special" must be included in the title of the class. Agility classes to include contact points & jumping classes where there are not contact obstacles. With this proviso classes are defined as follows:

Class Structure: a class may either be held as a **Graded class** or a **Combined class**. A Graded class may be scheduled for one or more consecutive grades with separate results & awards issued for each grade. A Combined class may be scheduled for more than one consecutive grade with one overall set of results.

Progression: Progression from each grade will require one agility win or three jumping wins at that grade, except the progression from Grade 6 will require 4 wins at Grade 6, two of which must be agility classes. Results from combined classes will only count towards progression from the dog's current grade.

Points Progression: at the handler's discretion a dog may progress up to grade 5 by winning 75 points at each grade, using the Agility Warrant points scheme, regulation K3.c refers, except that there is no requirement for a minimum number of agility points. If this method of progression is selected, the handler must ensure the show secretary signs the dog's Agility Record Book at the first show entered at the higher grade. There is no time limit on this progression, however, once a dog has progressed, it cannot return to a previous grade.

Only first prizes & points gained in standard classes at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows may be used for progression through the classes. (A dog is only eligible for one grade).

Grade 1 (Elementary)	For owners, handlers or dogs which have not gained a first place in an agility class or three first places in jumping classes at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows. N.B. Owners, handlers or dogs previously qualified out of grade 1 (Elementary) are not eligible for this class.
Grade 2 (Starters)	For owners, handlers or dogs which have qualified out of Grade 1 but have not gained a first place in an Agility Class or three Jumping Classes at Grade 2 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows. N.B. Owners, handlers or dogs previously qualified out of Grade 2 (Starters) are not eligible for this class.
Grade 3 (Graduate)	Open to dogs which are not eligible for Grade 1 or 2 or have elected to progress on points from Grade 2 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows & dogs which are not eligible for Grades 4, 5, 6 or 7.
Grade 4 (Novice)	Open to dogs which have gained a first place in an Agility Class or three Jumping Classes at Grade 3 or elected to progress on points from Grade 3 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows and are not eligible for Grades 3, 5, 6 or 7.
Grade 5 (Intermediate)	Open to dogs which have gained a first place in an Agility Class or three Jumping Classes at Grade 4 or elected to progress on points from Grade 4 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows and are not eligible for Grades 3, 4, 6 or 7.
Grade 6 (Senior)	Open to dogs which have gained a first place in an Agility Class or three Jumping Classes at Grade 5 or elected to progress on points from Grade 5 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows and are not eligible for Grades 3, 4, 6 or 7.
Grade 7 (Advanced)	Open to dogs which have gained a minimum of four first places at Grade 6 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows, two first places must be gained in Agility (not Jumping) Classes.

Trophies: - Less than 40 dogs = 1st place trophy: 40 dogs up to 79 dogs = 1st & 2nd place trophies: 80 dogs to 199 dogs = 1st to 3rd place trophy: 200 plus dogs = 1st to 4th place trophy

Rosettes:- Placings to 12% & clear round rosettes for unplaced dogs in all Grades/ Classes.

For each dog entered in each " Vegas" class the sum of £1.00 will go into the Class pot, which will be given out in the Vegas classes.

Example... 50 DOGS entered in Class 43 : Small Agility; Graded 1-4 would result in £50 being awarded out between those that gain a rosette in the grades

DOGS IN CARS ON HOT DAYS

Your dog is vulnerable and at risk during hot weather and the Kennel Club offers the following guidance to help guide you through the do's and don'ts travelling to and whilst at KC licensed events.

- When travelling to a show please take a moment to consider whether the route to the show is on a busy holiday route, and leave earlier to avoid increased time in traffic jams.
- If your vehicle is not air-conditioned seriously consider whether travelling to the show is a good idea at all.
- The vehicle should be as fully ventilated as possible, and plenty of stops should be taken, with lots of water available to drink.
- Ensure your dog is not sitting in full sunlight. There should be plenty of free flowing air around the dog.
- When at the show, never leave your dog in the vehicle.
- Keep the dog in the shade – take your own shade for example a large umbrella and always have plenty of water available to drink so your dog stays well hydrated.
- Avoid your dog taking part in unnecessary exertion, or from standing in exposed sunlight for extended lengths of time.

Remember, if you feel hot your dog is very likely to feel much hotter and dehydrated, and this could lead to dire results. Please look after your dog's welfare.

WARNING: IF YOUR DOG IS FOUND TO BE AT RISK FORCIBLE ENTRY TO YOUR VEHICLE MAY BE NECESSARY WITHOUT LIABILITY FOR ANY DAMAGE CAUSED.

Anyone whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not put a dog's health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. Breach of Kennel Club Regulations in this respect may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rules and Regulations.

Right to Refuse Entries. Exhibitors/Competitors are reminded that show societies have the right under Kennel Club Regulation to refuse any entry.
