PRIZES

Rosettes to at least 10% of entries in all classes except Special Junior Classes

TROPHIES - To 1ST PLACE ONLY (classes with 19 or less dogs) - To 2nd PLACE ONLY (classes with more than 19, but less than 50 dogs) - To 3rd PLACE (classes with 50 or more dogs) in all classes except Special Junior Classes.

Combined classes are counted as total in class whilst Graded classes are counted as total in Grade

Special Junior Classes – Rosettes to 10% of the class provided by WBSDS plus a goody bag kindly sponsored by Helen Fletcher – there are no trophies on offer in this class

Special Anysize jumping : Rosettes and Trophies as per usual standard classes but please note it is one set of awards across all heights of dog participating

Unplaced clear round rosettes in all classes to be collected on the day

***Best BSD Rosettes for WBSDS members only in all Large Classes and Anysize**

Combined classes are scheduled for the grades stated with one overall set of results for the whole class. Graded classes are scheduled for one or more grades with separate results and awards issued for each grade.

ELIGIBILITY FOR CLASSES

In the following definitions of classes First Prizes or other prize wins are those gained in standard classes at any Kennel Club licensed Championship Agility, Premier Agility, Open Agility or Limited Agility Shows (i.e. special classes and invitational events excepted). Only a first place with a clear round completed within the course time set by the judge will count towards grade progression.

Standard classes may be scheduled for Agility Shows, as Agility classes or Jumping classes. All standard classes must contain the Weaving Poles obstacle. Standard Agility classes must contain the following elements: "A Ramp", Dog Walk and See-Saw. With this proviso classes are defined as follows:-

Class Structure. A Class may either be held as a Graded Class or a Combined Class. A Graded Class may be scheduled for one or more consecutive Grades with separate results and awards issued for each grade. A Combined Class may be scheduled for more than one consecutive grade with one overall set of results.

Progression. Progression from each Grade will require one Agility win or three Jumping wins in standard classes at that grade, except that progression from Grade 5 will require 3 wins at Grade 5, one of which must be an agility class. Progression from Grade 6 will require 4 wins at Grade 6, two of which must be agility classes. Results from Combined Classes will only count towards progression from the dog's current grade.

Points Progression. At the handler's discretion a dog may progress up to Grade 4 by winning 100 points at each grade, using the Agility Warrant points scheme (Regulation K3.c refers), except that there is no requirement for a minimum number of agility points. If this method of progression is selected, the handler must ensure the Show Secretary signs the dog's Agility Record Book at the first show entered at the higher grade. There is no time limit on this progression, however once a dog has progressed, it cannot return to a previous grade.

Progression on points must be done prior to the closing date of entries. It is not possible to change a grade on points once entries have closed.

DEFINITION OF CLASSES – Standard Classes

Only first prizes and points gained in standard classes at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows may be used for progression through the classes. (A dog is only eligible for one grade). In defining the eligibility of the owner or handler for Grade 1, the three jumping wins and points progression referred to in the definition apply only to one dog and not an accumulation of dogs.

GRADE 1 (Elementary) : For owners, handlers or dogs which have not gained a first place in an Agility Class or three first places in Jumping Classes at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows. NB Owners, handlers or dogs previously qualified out of Grade 1 (Elementary) are not eligible for this class.

GRADE 2 (Starters) : Open to dogs which are not eligible for Grades 1, 3, 4, 5, 6 or 7 and have not gained a first place in an Agility Class or three first places in Jumping Classes at Grade 2 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows, or elected to progress on points from Grade 1. NB Owners, handlers or dogs previously qualified out of Grade 2 (Starters) are not eligible for this class.

GRADE 3 (Graduate) : Open to dogs which are not eligible for Grade 1 or 2 or have elected to progress on points from Grade 2 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows and dogs which are not eligible for Grades 4, 5, 6 or 7.

GRADE 4 (Novice) : Open to dogs which have gained a first place in an Agility Class or three first places in Jumping Classes at Grade 3 or elected to progress on points from Grade 3 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows and are not eligible for Grade 3, 5, 6 or 7.

GRADE 5 (Intermediate) : Open to dogs which have gained a first place in an Agility Class or three first places in Jumping Classes at Grade 4 or have elected to progress on points from Grade 4 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows and are not eligible for Grades 3, 4, 6 or 7.

GRADE 6 (Senior) : Open to dogs which have gained three first places at Grade 5 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows, one of which must have been in an Agility (not Jumping) class and are not eligible for Grades 3, 4, 5 or 7.

GRADE 7 (Advanced) : Open to dogs which have gained a minimum of 4 first places at Grade 6 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows, 2 first places must be gained in Agility (not Jumping) Classes.

DEFINITION OF CLASSES – Special Classes (including class rules)

Standard KC marking rules and equipment applies unless otherwise stated on each Special Class

Special Anysize Jumping - Open to dogs NOT entered into any other class. This class is open to Large, Medium and Small dogs which are not entered into any other classes at this show. There will be no weaves or tyre. Jump heights will be 35cm and 19cm. All dogs will compete against each other over the same course at the dog's preferred jump height. There will be one set of awards.

Special Junior Classes (Jumping or agility as specified on the class list)

Object : To encourage children into our sport, not to discourage or demoralise, all classes are open to Juniors up to 17 years of age, they can enter 1 class depending on their experience and Grade that they currently compete at.

Juniors can compete with any grade of dog, any size, but that dog can only compete for 1 child in 1 Junior class on the day of the show (note: the dog can be entered with any handler in the permitted standard classes).

There will be no Trophies on offer for these classes, but Rosettes will be awarded to 10% of the class, plus a Judges special will be on offer, and each competing child will receive a goodie bag.

Jump heights for these classes shall be the same as the KC standard jump/dog heights regulations as listed in the main rules. Standard KC equipment shall be used at all 3 levels.

Standard KC marking shall apply at all three levels. As usual the winner of the class shall be determined by the fastest clear round.

Level 1 : Introductory Jumping Class

Open to Junior's who have NOT won any Standard G1, G2 or G3 class at ANY show OR two Special Junior Agility and/or Jumping classes at any show.

Course design - This class should be a simple flowing course, with 1 simple change of handling side, Maximum of 6 weaves are permitted.

Level 2 : Intermediate Agility or Jumping Class

For Junior's who are more experienced, but who have not won into Grade 4 at any KC Open Agility show or won 4 or more Special Junior agility/jumping classes.

Course design – This course will be a little more challenging than level 1. No pull through's or round the back of jumps – the course should be set at G3 level.

Level 3 - Advanced Agility or Jumping

For Junior's who compete in their own right in Grade 4 and above.

A more challenging course set at approx Grade 4-5 .

The aim is still to encourage not demoralise the Juniors.

HEIGHT CLASSIFICATION OF DOGS

Small Dogs: for dogs measuring 350mm or under at the withers

Medium Dogs: for dogs measuring over 350mm and measuring 430mm or under at the withers

Large Dogs: for dogs measuring over 430mm at the withers.

SHOW RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. Dogs entered at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows must be registered at the Kennel Club in accordance with Kennel Club Regulations for Classification and Registration B, or else registration or transfer of registration must have been applied for. The registration number/Authority to Compete number will be required for each entry.
2. All dogs registered and resident outside of the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete (ATC) number before entry to the show/event can be made. All overseas entries without a Kennel Club Registration number or an Authority to Compete number will be returned to the exhibitor/competitor.

3. Entry fees: Single entries £3.00 per dog per class irrespective of hard copy or online entry. Camping at £20 for the two nights (Friday and Saturday only). Helping WBSDS members entry fees are £2 00 per class and £15 for camping.
4. Prizes – no monetary prizes are on offer. Awards for each class are listed in the awards section of the schedule.
5. Entries may be made via the internet by going to www.firstplaceprocessing.com
6. The Working Belgian Shepherd Dog Society Committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.
7. Only dogs of 18 calendar months of age and over on the day of competition are eligible for competition at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows.
8. No entry capping levels have been applied to this show.
9. Not For Competition entries will be accepted for dogs aged four calendar months and over. Dogs must be Kennel Club registered with their details recorded on the entry form.
10. No bitch in season is allowed to compete.
11. No person shall carry out punitive correction or harsh handling of a dog at any time within the boundaries of the Show.
12. Dogs must not wear any type of slip, half-slip collar or lead when under test. A flat, close fitting, leather or webbing collar is permitted, providing the only attachment is a plain identification panel as an integral part of the collar ie. not attached by a ring.
13. Should a judge be unable to fulfill the appointment to judge the Committee reserves the right to appoint another judge.
14. No competitor shall impugn the decision of the judge or judges.
15. Sponsors for the show are listed on the schedule.
16. Kennel Club standard marking Regulations apply.
17. Special Anysize Jumping - Open to dogs NOT entered into any other class. This class is open to Large, Medium and Small dogs which are not entered into any other classes at this show. There will be no weaves or tyre. Jump heights will be 35cm and 19cm. All dogs will compete against each other over the same course at the dog's preferred jump height. There will be one set of awards.
18. The height limits for dogs are:
 - a. Large dogs – for dogs measuring over 430mm (1ft 5ins) at the withers
 - b. Medium dogs – for dogs measuring over 350mm (1ft 1.75ins) and measuring 430mm (1ft 5ins) or under at the withers
 - c. Small dogs – for dogs measuring 350mm (1ft 1.75ins) or under at the withers.
19. Judges at an Agility Show may not enter for competition a dog that is recorded in their ownership or part ownership, or handle a dog at the Show at which they are judging. Dogs will be disqualified if proved to have been handled in the class by the scheduled judge's spouse or immediate family, or resident at the same address as the scheduled judge.
20. Withdrawal Removal of dogs from Competition: Following discussion between the show management and/or a veterinary surgeon, a dog shall be withdrawn from competition prevented from competing and/or removed from the Show if it is:-
 - a. A bitch which is in season.
 - b. Suffering from any infectious diseases or contagious disease.
 - c. Interfering with the safety or chance of winning of an opponent.
 - d. Of such temperament or so much out of hand is so much out of control as to be a danger to the safety of any person or other animal.
 - e. Likely to cause suffering to the dog if it continues competing.

The circumstances of such a removal shall be recorded in the competition/show Incident Book and submitted to the Kennel Club

21. In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including 25 days before the start of the competition, i.e. 7th July 2015, shall be counted when entering for any class. For these purposes a competition shall be defined as all classes covered within the same schedule. In the event that a dog becomes eligible for the next grade at a particular show, after the entry for that show has been sent, it is the competitor's responsibility to notify the show secretary at least 14 days before the date of the show. The dog should then be moved into the corresponding number of classes as were entered at the lower grade. If there are fewer or no classes available for the next grade the competitor should be offered a refund of the relevant entry fees.
22. Should circumstances so dictate the Society, in consultation with the Judges, may alter arrangements as necessary. Such changes and the circumstances surrounding them must be reported to the Kennel Club.
23. In the event that the show is cancelled due to unforeseen circumstances the society will refund fees less reasonably incurred expenses on receipt of a stamped addressed envelope submitted to the show secretary within 1 month of the show date. Any refunds will be made within 3 months of the show date.
24. Except for mobility aids, nothing shall be carried in the hand or while the dog is under test and food shall not be given to a dog whilst in the ring.
25. Should the judge deem a re-run is required, any result and/or faults gained in the previous run must be discounted.
26. Separate forms must be completed by each owner and must be signed by the owner or his authorized agent in accordance with the provisions specified thereon. Entry forms must be accompanied with the appropriate fees.
25. Free entry passes – All competitors will be provided with a free pass enabling them to enter the event at any time of the day their competition is scheduled, but in the case of a dog owned in partnership only one such pass will be issued.
28. Competition of Dogs Suffering from Contagious or Infectious Disease - No dogs suffering from infectious or contagious disease or having been exposed to such disease during the period of 21 days prior to the Competition may compete. Competitors infringing the Regulation will be liable to be fined and/or dealt with under Kennel Club

Rule A11.

29. It is the competitor's responsibility to be available for their class and running order. Competitors must run as close to their running order as possible. Failure to do so may be reported to the Kennel Club.
30. Animals in Event - No animal other than one officially entered shall be brought into the precincts of the event during its continuance, except any dogs registered to assist the disabled, or dogs required for educational or instructional purposes or by permission of the General Committee. However, at the discretion of the Show Society, a dog brought to the show by a spectator may be admitted into the precincts of the dog show, with the proviso that those in charge of the dog sign a declaration confirming the dog is free from disease and that the dog will be kept under proper control at all times.
31. A pay on the day class will be held if time permits.
32. A practice ring may be available to dogs entered for competition at the show, if space allows. This ring must be supervised by a responsible adult with agility knowledge.
33. Welfare of Dogs - An exhibitor (or competitor) whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not knowingly put their dogs' health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. A breach of this Regulation may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rules and Regulations.
34. Please clean up after your dog and place in bins provided. Anyone knowingly not doing so may be asked to leave the venue and will forfeit any remaining class entries.
35. No refunds due to incorrect entries, or requests for special running orders, will be entertained.
36. All competitors who enter any special classes agree to the rules as defined in the schedule by WBSDS.
37. Competitors must follow the stewards' instructions with regard to parking, camping and conduct within the show boundaries.
38. Goods may NOT be sold within the precincts of the show without prior permission of WBSDS.
39. Rosettes and Trophies can only be collected on the day of the show and will NOT be forwarded.

OVERNIGHT ACCOMMODATION AT THE COLLEGE

- You can book a room at the college by contacting the show secretary on secretary.wbsds@gmail.com. The cost will be £46.30 for a single person room (inc vat, excluding breakfast) per night. You may have your dogs sleep in the room, BUT they must NOT be left in the rooms when you are not there. Any damage you or your dogs cause will be charged directly to you. Accommodation fees must be paid 4 weeks in advance of the event.

CAMPING:

- Available for a fixed fee of £20 for the weekend. Please include your camping fees of £20 with your entries.
- There is a strict limit of 80 camping units plus Show members allocated in the first instance to all those who have offered to help at the show on a first come first served basis the camping is fully booked at the time that your entry is received.
- The envelope containing your running orders will be your camping pass showing your permitted time of arrival. It is essential that you carry this with you as there will be security at the site entrance
- Only campers who have paid in advance will be allowed in the camping area
- **No camping units allowed on the showground before 3.00pm on Friday 31st July 2015, if you do arrive before you will be asked to wait in the car park.**
- Please arrive before 9.00pm after which time the gates will be locked
- We regret that camping will not be available for Sunday night 2nd August 2015 and we request that the site is cleared by 7.30pm on Sunday 2nd August 2015.
- Please leave a minimum space of 20 feet between units
- Training equipment is not allowed in the camping areas
- The joining of gardens is prohibited
- No dogs to be left loose in gardens, or tethered to vehicles, whilst unattended
- Fire extinguishers will be sited around the venue
- All camping units are required to have a bucket of water at the front of the unit at all times
- There are toilets on site, plus an emptying point for chemical toilets
- PLEASE NOTE : there is no tannoy at this show, prize givings/presentations will take place immediately after each class ends at the ring tent.

DIRECTIONS TO VENUE (POSTCODE TF10 8NB):

From the North - Take the M6 South. Leave the M6 at junction 14 (signed Stone and Eccleshall, A34). Follow the A5013, signed to Eccleshall. After 1.5 miles turn left onto the B5405. At the T junction in Woodseaves, turn left on to the A519 and follow signs for Newport. Once you have reached the junction with the A41 turn right onto the A41 and follow *** below.

From the South

From the South Leave the M54 at Junction 3 and take the A41 towards Whitchurch. Continue on the A41 through 4 roundabouts

***follow A41 for another approx. half a mile signposted for Edgmond, once you have turned into this road you will see a church on the right hand side with another sign for Edgmond to the right – IGNORE this sign as this road is very narrow and not suitable for caravans. Continue until the outskirts of Newport, you will then see a sign post on your left hand signposting to turn right for B5062, Edgmond, Shrewsbury & Harper Adams University – take this road which leads all the way to the venue (approx. 1.5 miles) which will be on your right hand side past the Lamb public house. There is a pelican crossing close to the entrance where you will turn in.
