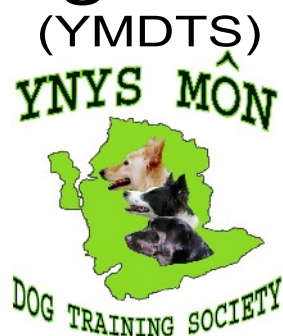

ELIGIBILITY FOR CLASSES

In the following definitions of classes First Prizes or other prize wins are those gained in standard classes at any Kennel Club licensed Championship Agility, Premier Agility, Open Agility or Limited Agility Shows (i.e. special classes and invitational events excepted). Only a first place with a clear round completed within the course time set by the judge will count towards grade progression.

Standard classes may be scheduled for Agility Shows, as Agility classes or Jumping classes. All standard classes must contain the Weaving Poles obstacle. Standard Agility classes must contain the following elements: "A Ramp", Dog Walk and See-Saw. With this proviso classes are defined as follows:-

Class Structure. A Class may either be held as a Graded Class or a Combined Class. A Graded Class may be scheduled for one or more consecutive Grades with separate results and awards issued for each grade. A Combined Class may be scheduled for more than one consecutive grade with one overall set of results.

Progression. Progression from each Grade will require one Agility win or three Jumping wins in standard classes at that grade, except that progression from Grade 5 will require 3 wins at Grade 5, one of which must be an agility class. Progression from Grade 6 will require 4 wins at Grade 6, two of which must be agility classes. Results from Combined Classes will only count towards progression from the dog's current grade.

Points Progression. At the handler's discretion a dog may progress up to Grade 4 by winning 100 points at each grade, using the Agility Warrant points scheme (Regulation K3.c refers), except that there is no requirement for a minimum number of agility points. If this method of progression is selected, the handler must ensure the Show Secretary signs the dog's Agility Record Book at the first show entered at the higher grade. There is no time limit on this progression, however once a dog has progressed, it cannot return to a previous grade. Progression on points must be done prior to the closing date of entries. It is not possible to change a grade on points once the entries have closed.

STANDARD CLASSES

Only first prizes and points gained in standard classes at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows may be used for progression through the classes. (A dog is only eligible for one grade). In defining the eligibility of the owner or handler for Grade 1, the three jumping wins and points progression referred to in the definition apply only to one dog and not an accumulation of dogs.

Grade 1 (Elementary)

For owners, handlers or dogs which have not gained a first place in an Agility Class or three first places in Jumping Classes at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows. *N.B. Owners, handlers or dogs previously qualified out of Grade 1, (Elementary) are not eligible for this class.*

Grade 2 (Starters)

Open to dogs which are not eligible for Grades 1, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7 and have not gained a first place in an Agility Class or three first places in Jumping Classes at Grade 2 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows, or elected to progress on points from Grade 1. *N.B. Owners, handlers or dogs previously qualified out of Grade 2 (Starters) are not eligible for this class.*

Grade 3 (Graduate)

Open to dogs which are not eligible for Grade 1 or 2 or have elected to progress on points from Grade 2 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows and dogs which are not eligible for Grade 4, 5, 6 or 7.

Grade 4 (Novice)

Open to dogs which have gained a first place in an Agility Class or three first places in Jumping Classes at Grade 3 or elected to progress on points from Grade 3 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows and are not eligible for Grade 3, 5, 6 or 7.

Grade 5 (Intermediate)

Open to dogs which have gained a first place in an Agility Class or three first places in Jumping Classes at Grade 4 and are not eligible for Grade 3, 4, 6 or 7.

Grade 6 (Senior)

Open to dogs which have gained a minimum of 3 first places at Grade 5 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows, one of which must have been gained in an Agility (not Jumping) Class, and are not eligible for Grade 3, 4, 5 or 7.

Grade 7 (Advanced)

Open to dogs which have gained a minimum of 4 first places at Grade 6 at Kennel Club Licensed Agility Shows, 2 first places must be gained in Agility (not Jumping) Classes.

SPECIAL CLASSES

Veterans Jumping

The class is open to Large, Medium and Small dogs aged 9 years and over on the date of competition. Handlers can choose on the day at which height they wish their dog to run. Jump heights will be 450 mm, 350 mm or 250 mm. The course will reflect the ages of the dogs. Dogs may not enter any other class on the day of competition other than the Special Anysize classes. There will be no weaves, tyre or long jump.

Anysize Jumping & Anysize Agility

The classes are intended for Large, Medium and Small dogs that are not entered in any other class at this show apart from the Veteran class and is particularly suitable for inexperienced dogs or handlers, and those dogs that are unable to compete at their full height. Handlers can choose on the day at which height they wish their dog to run. Jump heights will be 450 mm, 350 mm or 250 mm. There will be no weaves, tyre or long jump. The A-frame will be set at a height of 1 m 30 cm (52 ins). The course will be simple and flowing.

Marking for special classes will be the same as for standard classes. Wins, places and clear rounds in special classes will not count towards agility warrant points or grade progression at Kennel Club shows.

Rosettes & Trophies

- Rosettes to at least 10% of entries in all classes,
- Clear round rosettes in all classes
- Trophies to 3rd place in classes or parts over 50 dogs; 2nd place in classes or parts under 50 dogs; trophies to 1st place in classes and parts under 20 dogs

RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. Dogs entered at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows must be registered at the Kennel Club in accordance with Kennel Club Regulations for Classification and Registration B, or else registration or transfer of registration must have been applied for. The registration number/ authority to compete (ATC) number will be required for each entry.
2. All dogs registered and resident outside the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete (ATC) number before entry to the show/event can be made. All overseas entries without a Kennel Club Registration number or an Authority to Compete number will be returned to the exhibitor/competitor.
3. Entry fees: £2.90 per class, helping YMDTS members £1.90 per class, camping £9 per night.
4. No prize money will be awarded.
5. Entries and fees to: Ynys Môn Show, Longhedge Show Processing, Longhedge House, Thoroton NG13 9DS or online at www.firstplaceprocessing.com
6. The Committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.
7. Only dogs of 18 calendar months of age and over on the day of competition are eligible for competition at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows.
8. There are NO capped classes at this show.
9. Not For Competition entries will be accepted for dogs aged four calendar months and over. Dogs must be Kennel Club registered with their details recorded on the entry form.
10. No bitch in season is allowed to compete.
11. No person shall carry out punitive correction or harsh handling of a dog at any time within the boundaries of the Show.
12. Dogs must not wear any type of slip, half-slip collar or lead when under test. A flat, close fitting, leather or webbing collar is permitted, providing the only attachment is a plain identification panel as an integral part of the collar ie. not attached by a ring.
13. Should a judge be unable to fulfil the appointment to judge the Committee reserves the right to appoint another judge.
14. No competitor shall impugn the decision of the judge or judges.
15. Our sponsors:G.W. Morris Groundcare Landscaping & Fencing Contractors. Any offers of sponsorship received after publication of the schedule will be displayed at the show.
16. Kennel Club standard marking regulations apply for all standard classes.
17. Competitors in Special Classes, Anysize and Veteran, may choose their jump height from the heights offered as follows: 450 mm, 350 mm or 250 mm. The A-Frame will be set at a height of 1 m 30 cm (52 ins) in Anysize Agility.

18. The height limit for dogs.

a. Large Dog classes - For dogs measuring over 430 mm (1ft 5 ins) at the withers.

b. Medium Dog classes - For dogs measuring over 350 mm (1ft 1.75 ins) and measuring 430 mm (1ft 5ins) or under at the withers.

c. Small Dog classes - For dogs measuring 350 mm (1ft 1.75 ins) or under at the withers.

19. Judges at an Agility Show may not enter for competition a dog which is recorded in their ownership or part ownership; or handle a dog at the Show at which they are judging. Dogs may be disqualified if proved to have been handled in the class by the scheduled judge's spouse or immediate family, or resident at the same address as the scheduled judge.

20. Removal of dogs from Competition:

Following discussion between the show management and/or a veterinary surgeon, a dog shall be prevented from competing and/or removed from the Show if it is:-

a. A bitch in season.

b. Suffering from any infectious diseases or contagious disease.

c. Interfering with the safety or chance of winning of an opponent.

d. Of such temperament or is so much out of control as to be a danger to the safety of any person or other animal.

e. Likely to cause suffering to the dog if it continues competing.

The circumstances of such a removal shall be recorded in the competition/show Incident Book and submitted to the Kennel Club.

21. In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including 25 days before the start of the competition, i.e. **14th April 2015** shall be counted when entering for any class. For these purposes a competition shall be defined as all classes covered within the same schedule. In the event that a dog becomes eligible for the next grade at a particular show, after the entry for that show has been sent, it is the competitor's responsibility to notify the show secretary at least 14 days before the date of the show. The dog will then be moved into the appropriate class(es) for the next grade. The dog must be moved into the corresponding number of classes as were entered at the lower grade. If there are fewer or no classes available for the next grade the competitor will be offered a refund of the relevant entry fees.

22. Should circumstances so dictate the Society, in consultation with the Judges, may alter arrangements as necessary. Such changes and the circumstances surrounding them will be reported to the Kennel Club.

23. In the event that the show is cancelled due to unforeseen circumstances, the society will refund fees, less reasonably incurred expenses. If the show processor has the provisions to do so, competitors will be refunded in the manner in which they had entered the show, but in any event the society will refund fees within 3 months of the show date to all those who had entered and requested a refund within 1 month of the show date.

24. Except for mobility aids, nothing shall be carried in the hand or while the dog is under test and food shall not be given to a dog whilst in the ring.

25. Should the judge deem a re-run is required, any result and/or faults gained in the previous run must be discounted.

26. Separate entry forms must be completed by each owner and must be signed by the owner or his authorised agent in accordance with provisions specified thereon. Entry forms must be accompanied by the appropriate fees.

27. Passes are not required to gain access to the showground.

28. Competition of Dogs Suffering from Contagious or Infectious Disease

No dogs suffering from infectious or contagious disease or having been exposed to such disease during the period of 21 days prior to the Competition may compete. Competitors infringing the Regulation will be liable to be fined and/or dealt with under Kennel Club Rule A11.

29. It is the competitor's responsibility to be available for their class and running order. Competitors must run as close to their running order as possible. Failure to do so may be reported to the Kennel Club.

30. Animals in Event

No animal other than one officially entered shall be brought into the precincts of the event during its continuance, except any dogs registered to assist the disabled, or dogs required for educational or instructional purposes or by permission of the General Committee.

However, at the discretion of the show society, a dog brought to the show by a spectator may be admitted into the precincts of the dog show, with the proviso that those in charge of the dog sign a declaration confirming the dog is free from disease and that the dog will be kept under proper control at all times.

31. A pay on the day class will be held if time permits.

32. A practice ring may be available to dogs entered for competition at the show, if space allows. This ring must be supervised by a responsible adult with agility knowledge.

33. Welfare of Dogs

An exhibitor (or competitor) whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not knowingly put their dogs' health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. A breach of this Regulation may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rules and Regulations.

ADDITIONAL SHOWGROUND REGULATIONS AND INFORMATION

1. Please drive at SLOW walking pace (5 mph) throughout the site.

2. Competitors are to park/camp only in designated areas as directed. **No arrivals after 10 pm except by prior arrangement – please call 01407 810610.**

3. First Aid Box will be situated in the Secretary's Tent. Water and Toilets are near to the entrance of the showground. Location of fire equipment will be signed.

4. Parents are responsible for their children and should ensure children know how to behave around dogs.

5. Owners remain responsible for their dogs at all times and must show care and respect for others.

6. Please respect areas marked private. Do not approach or feed the horses.

Camping

7. Pitch numbers will be marked and stewards will direct you to your pitch on arrival.

8. Units must be equipped with fire fighting equipment. A fire bucket should be placed in front of each unit. Guy ropes or other protuberances should be marked so as to be visible to people walking by.

9. Dogs should not be tethered where they can jump at people or other dogs or be scared themselves.

10. Generators are to be switched off at 11 pm each evening.

11. Hot barbecues must not be put on the grass, left accessible to dogs or put in the skip.

Exercise area and the river

12. Dogs must be exercised in the designated areas only and be kept under control at all times whilst on the show venue. Dogs should be kept on leads except when competing or in the exercise area. Be aware of other dogs in the vicinity when letting dogs off lead/throwing toys etc. Only three dogs per adult should be off lead in the exercise area at any time.

13. Care must be taken near the river. Children under 16 and dogs must be closely supervised when in the vicinity of the river which marks the boundary between the exercise field and neighbouring property. A life belt is available on the river bank.

14. Please pick up after your dogs and place bags in the bins provided.

(Sat Nav may take you on to an unsuitable narrow road).

Follow signs from the A55 or A5 or minor roads towards the Britannia Bridge – signed Caergybi/Holyhead.

From South: From A5, join the A55 (dual carriageway) at Bangor traffic island (J11, signed Caergybi / Holyhead). From A55 follow the Caergybi/Holyhead signs over the Britannia Bridge. Leave the A55 at J5 (signed BRYNGWRAN A5), turning RIGHT onto A4080 going over A55. At crossroads turn LEFT (signed BRYNGWRAN A5) into village, past pub on your left (IORWERTH ARMS). Soon after pub take first left into narrow road opposite a pale blue cottage. Then****

From North (Holyhead): A55 towards Bangor. Leave A55 at J4, follow A5 to Bryngwran, turn right opposite pale blue cottage. Then****

On Anglesey: Follow signs to the A55 leaving at J4 or J5 and follow instructions above as appropriate until****

**** All routes: Follow road under road-bridge, past Bryn Glas garage on left. After white house on right, (horses heads on gateposts), turn RIGHT at next crossroads. (Signed dead end) Follow road to T junction. Turn RIGHT, signed PODS Tai Lawr, follow road over cattle grid and left - show venue will be signed.
